

Kaitlyn Aurelia Smith & Suzanne Ciani

Sunergy brings together Kaitlyn Aurelia Smith and Suzanne Ciani synthesists for the thirteenth install of FRKWYS, RVNG Intl.'s intergenerational collaboration series.


For this edition, a panorama of the Pacific Coast provides the place and headspace for exploratory Buchla synthesizer passages that meditate on a life-giving form vast and volatile with change.

The LP version includes a printed inner sleeve and a high-quality digital album download. LP and CD versions include the bonus track "Retrograde."

For some electronic musicians, the sound is primarily a formal or aesthetic concern; for Kaitlyn Aurelia Smith, it's spiritual. The music she makes with her Buchla modular synthesizer extends her yoga practice: a means of self-knowledge, a way of finding a balance between mind, body, and the world around her. The Bolinas, California, musician calls the album "my expression of love and appreciation for electricity" that is, an attempt to channel vibrations into a shape both resonant and meaningful. She composed the album as part of a daily practice of physical movement, and it shows: Unlike drone-based ambient, which puts its focus on static tones,

Suzanne is a five-time Grammy award-nominated composer, electronic music pioneer, and neo-classical recording artist who has released over 20 solo albums including "Seven Waves," and "The Velocity of Love," along with a landmark quad LP "LIVE Quadraphonic," which restarted her Buchla modular performances. Her work has been featured in films, games, and countless commercials as well.

She was inducted into the first class of Keyboard Magazine's Hall of Fame alongside other synth luminaries, including Bob Moog, Don Buchla and Dave Smith and received the Moog Innovation Award. Most recently, she is the recipient of the Independent Icon Award from A2IM.








The Mosaic of Transformation is awash in waves of motion, as layer upon layer of arpeggios and pads roll and crest and shift. https://kaitlynaureliasmith.com
It amounts to the most expressive and lyrical work of Smith's career so far and the most surprising, too. A short, burbling introduction gives way to gentle chants and string-quartet echoes in "Remembering"; the pointillist "Understanding Body Messages" leads to buoyant, mantra-like vocals and even solid drum beats in "The Steady Heart." It all builds to an ecstatic finish in the form of "Expanding Electricity," which weaves together ideas from across the spectrum: minimalism, contemporary classical, new age, even folk. "How can I help to serve you so you can do what you do?" she asks, sounding benevolent and beatific. It might be the voice of electricity itself, a current ready to carry us to another world.



Tensegrity-Collectors Edition





The original Tensegrity compilation album released in 2015 encapsulated the idea of the structural principle based on a system of isolated components, never touching each other and under continuous tension.

At the start of the pandemic, this term seemed somewhat prophetic and entirely appropriate, so we put together Tensegrity Vol.2, which includes 11 individual tracks featuring new and old ...TXT artists and a 50-minute full seamless analogue mix by black particles.

Tensegrity Vol.3 encapsulates the heavier side of ...TXT and includes nine individual tracks plus a 48-minute full seamless analogue mix. This collectors edition is all three albums together, housed in a laser-cut, etched and hand-numbered wooden box.

Zoan is the first digital single from the upcoming album Urbus, scheduled for CD and vinyl release in early April, Dark | Electro-acoustic | Avant-garde. This rhythmic, mid-tempo track depicts a mysterious urban environment without using dance beats or conventional drums. Hints of glitch and sparse percussion rise above a wash of atmospheric electronica and driving bass.




AeTopus

A brave, dark strain of ethereal instrumental electronic music wafts from a former chicken breeding warehouse in the wee hours of the morning. Inside the downtown Bellingham, Washington compound, composer/producer Bryan Hughes labours over his latest works in a modest, uncluttered art studio space. He's an artist who has hit that elusive creative milestone of garnering prime industry acclaim and accolades from fiercely original music that defies genre classification. aetopus.com

I create electronic music that includes acoustic percussion, field and studio recordings, and vintage synthesis. My creative approach is steeped in Berlin School electronic music traditions, Abstract Expressionism, modern ambient and downtempo, and the cinematic soundtracks of the twentieth century.

With Pathways, Drifting in Silence joins forces with Drew M. Geiger of E J R M. The album is strident and victorious, blazing a path forward. While still squarely within the meditative realm of ambient and drone, there is momentum to the music, a definite pace. Derrick Stembridge (the man behind Drifting in Silence) interlinks roaming piano, tender guitar, and aching strings with his signature lush pads. Like a flower blooming, the tranquil beauty of this steadily unwinding album is only more apparent in time. Drew M. Geiger of E J R M adds an overall organic texture across the album.

Pathways by Drifting In Silence and E J R M is perhaps the most characterful release to date and etched within the sounds of these five tracks; there is a definite drama and a deliberate execution of various evocative


On July 21, a small wildfire began burning over the northern half of Evia, an island around 30 miles northeast of Athens. Over the next 20 days — most of which exceeded 100 degrees Fahrenheit, or 38 degrees Celsius — it swelled into a vast conflagration, sweeping from one coastline of Evia to another and racking up a staggering balance sheet of damage: 120,000 acres of burned forest, hundreds of millions of euros in economic loss, and the wholesale evacuation of dozens of villages and thousands of islanders. Two people were killed.

L'Atome- started in 1997. E Clark Cornell and Eduard Polinais released 3 L'Atome albums: "The Flash of Light" (1997) ", The Golden Age" (1998) and finally "Spiritual Meltdown" (1999), available on Amazon. The devastation, though shocking, isn't new: Swaths of Greece burn virtually every summer. This year's destruction pales in comparison to the summer of 2007, when fires across the Peloponnese and southern Evia burned 670,000 acres of forest and farmland. And for human life, worse still was the summer of 2018, when the seaside town of Mati was razed by one of this century's deadliest fires, killing 102 residents.



THE LIVING EARTH SHOW The Living Earth Show Collaborates with Composer Danny Clay

> on an experimental new age album created as a sonic resource for comfort and calm

Recorded over the course of the COVID-19 pandemic, the album was released on Earthy Records.

Music for Hard Times was composed by Danny Clay in March 2020 as an eight-part series of "calming strategies" as his and other working musicians' lives came to a standstill during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Recorded in isolation and compiled and edited by Clay, Music for Hard Times exists in two parts. Book I was recorded in April 2020 in the homes of guitarist Travis Andrews and percussionist Andy Meyerson of The Living Earth Show using instruments, voices, field recordings, and found objects. Book 2 was recorded in 2021 and includes young musicians from the San Francisco Girls Chorus - led by Valerie Sainte-Agathe - and the San Francisco Conservatory of Music, led by Edwin Outwater.

With Music for Hard Times, Danny Clay aimed at answering the question: "Is it possible for us to use the tools of classical art music to make people feel better?" To test these strategies, Clay called upon longtime collaborators Meyerson and Andrews of The Living Earth Show, who spent the following weeks recording the sixteen hours of raw material that became Music for Hard Times Book I

In January 2021, the duo enlisted the San Francisco Girls' Chorus and students from the San Francisco Conservatory to help realize and refine Clay's vision. Music for Hard Times Book 2 emerged as the collective product of hundreds of hours of recordings by these scattered forces, with recordings made all over the world sent to Clay's home studio in San Francisco to create a whole

Deepspace is Brisbane, Australia-based ambient musician Mirko Ruckels. His hypnotic, glacial, dreamy and atmospheric work is created with various synthesisers, software and acoustic instruments such as bells, guitars and piano.

Superradiance is the dazzling 12th studio album by star-faring Australian electronic musician Deepspace and his first on Projekt records. Dream-like electronic ambient music with glittering, minimal melodic and harmonic expanses impressionistically cast as sonic light, appearing and disappearing as it overlaps to form new hues that shimmer, interact and then vanish. The album is a conceptual expedition through the heavens. The listener's ideas about space and our species' journey inform the narrative detail, subtly guiding the experience with tantalising clues. Polygraphic wildlife, Venusian orchids, leaving Earth, microbial lifeforms, these provocative ideas and titles are meant as prompts: an image, a feeling that activates the listener's odyssey.

The intermingling of science and art holds sway over Superradiance's conceptual and stylistic elements. Serene and futuristic scenarios wash over the listener, beckoning them onward into the "sky inside the mind" — their imagination. Influences include Brian Eno and Steve Roach and art music composers such as Claude Debussy and Francis Poulenc appearing to influence some of the harmony and the ephemeral and somehow proudly introverted nature of the musical parts.
