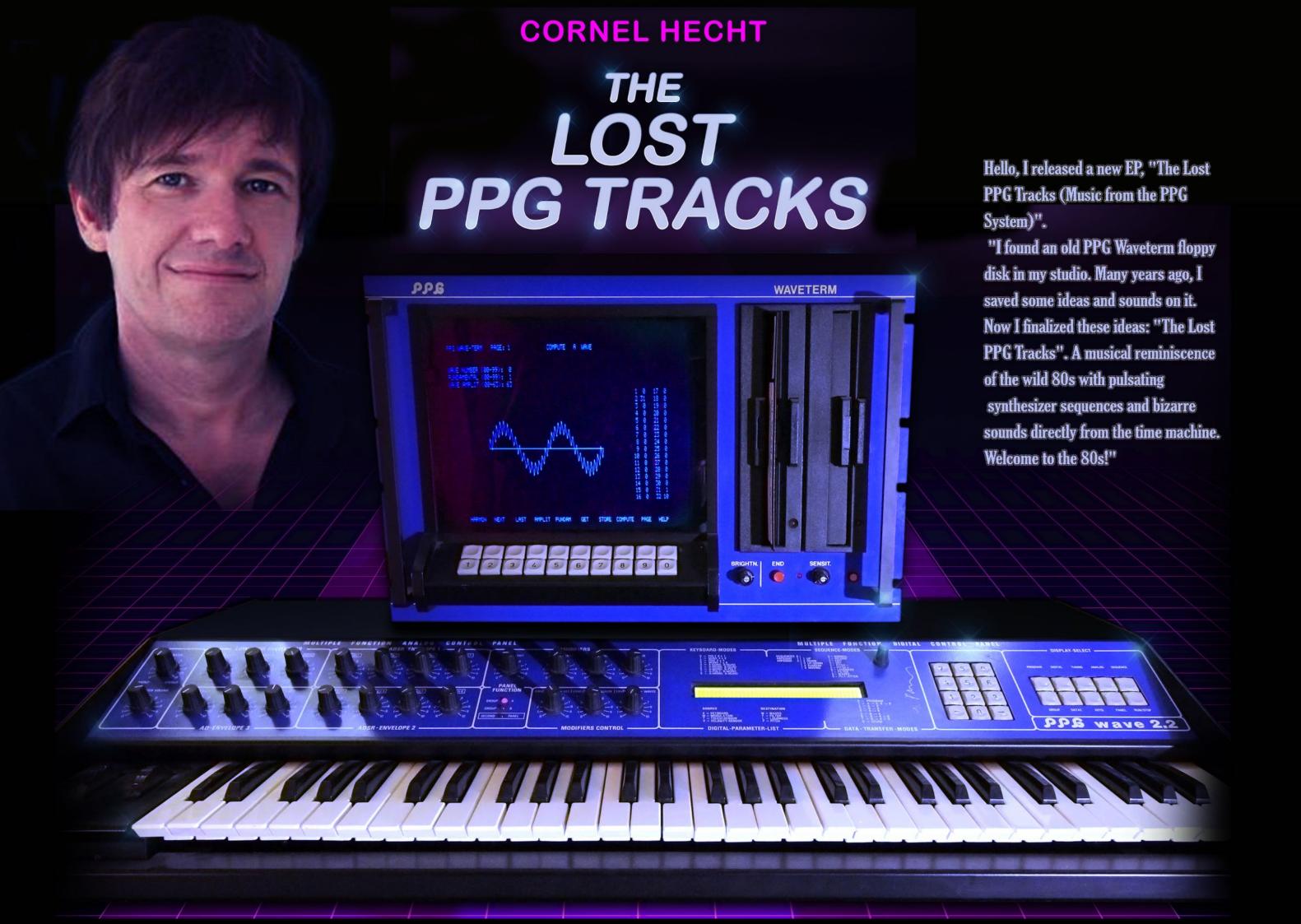

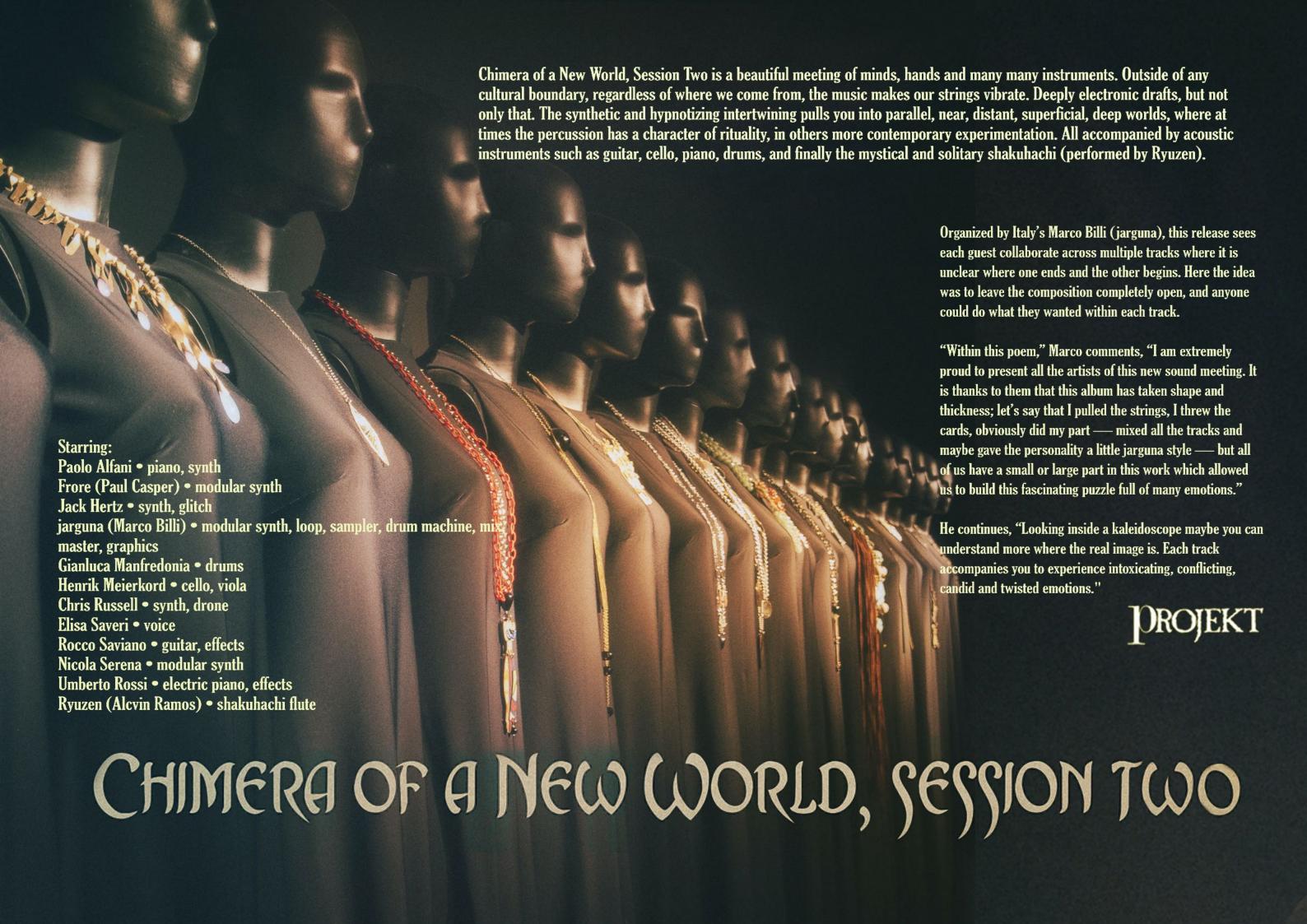

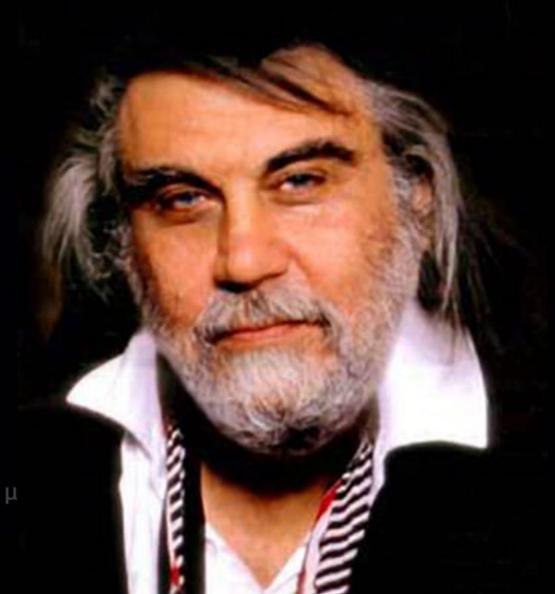

STANDART THE LAST SUNSET

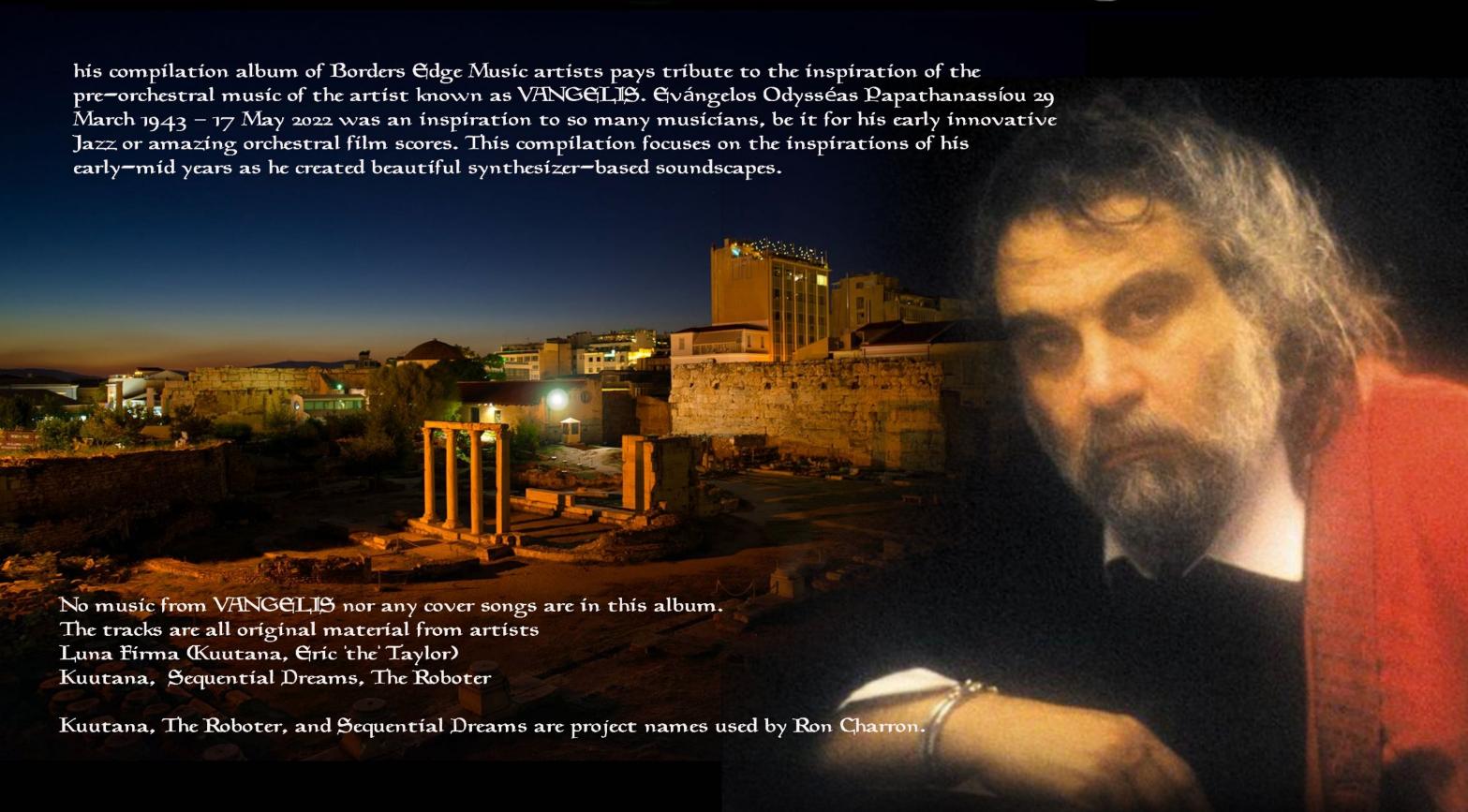

A fitting tribute from Stan Dart in memory of the great master Vangelis who passed away on the 17th May 2022. R.I.P.

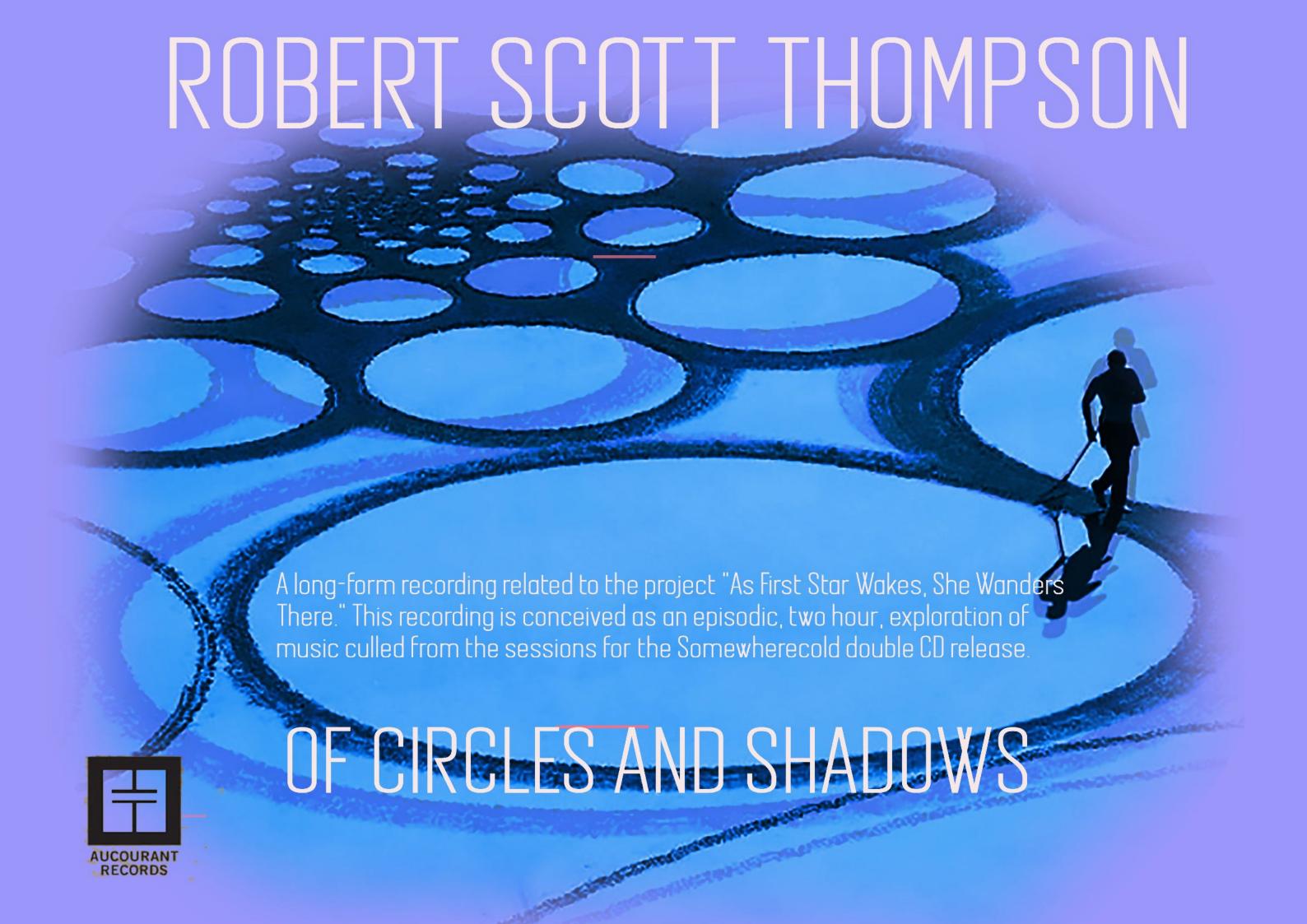

On his seventh Projekt Records release, Australian ambient composer the Adelaidean finds inspiration in simplicity, contrasting purposeful harmonic progressions with melodic lines that thread between calm joy and sustained melancholy. Eternity Is seeks universal truths in both music and thought, evoking the intimate and the infinite through electronic textures that echo a wide variety of sources including the Adelaidean's own award-winning verse.

With each title forming a haiku when paired with the albums title, these four tone poems pit the vast against the everyday by creating vocabularies for mysteries that words cannot fully express. Four poems, and four metaphorical seasons, each drawn using different palettes of sound. The spare synthesis of the album opener leaves carefully crafted spaces for acceptance as the wheel of time turns again to winter. Doom-laden bass hits then herald the return of the hot Australia summer, over a resonant backdrop of simmering dissonance. The piercing, ever-unsatisfied yearning of the Southern Spring, via bells, tolls patiently while deeper forces swirl and shift in the background. Eternity Is closes with choral clusters that rise and fall in waves, evoking the rich golds and oranges of Adelaide's finest season. Hypnotic, haunting, eternal.

This year in music and meditation can be played in any order. A symphony of polished sound guides the listener to uncertain destinations, where, deeply hidden against an impressionistic wash, one might hear a faint morse code signal spelling out the title of the album: an answering call from the void itself, as all questions reverberate to black while the sound textures flow continuously in the sensitive moments.



Equinox is a sound distillation from an idea created in 2019 that has taken definitive form in recent months as a serene, breathing, bright and positive long track. Distinct, undulating streams of synths create a silky smooth, emotionally caressing plot, slowly moving in gentle spirals of majestic chords. The mesmerizing, dreamy texture lingers for nearly 74 minutes to deliver a calming session of soothing back and forth, like a gentle wave of sound with a shimmering light. Powerful synthesizers make a statement of presence and unity throughout the piece, an atmospheric invitation to celebrate the passing of the different life stages. Here again, Max Corbacho excavates a sound exculture based on honesty and independence as a distinctive mark from the beginning of his career as an ambient space producer more than twenty years ago. A piece for equanimity, hope and positivity, a synth meditation celebrating sonic alignment with life and wholeness.



Harry Bertoia, already a renowned American sculptor, heard the resonant possibilities in the fine metals he used and began building sound sculpture in the 1950's. He dedicated the last 20 years of his life to his Sonambient work. ☐ Bertoia's recordings are a celebration of sustained tones, long decay, drone,intervalic relationships, healing vibrations, deep listening and shimmering harmonics.

Bertoia points to a sculpture that looks like a cluster of thin metal rods, dozens of them, with small weights on top. They look like metallic cattails swaying in a breeze. "This one I think is, in my own opinion, one of Harry's very best tones or tonal qualities in a sound piece, says Harry's son Val.

To play the sculpture, he brings the weights together gently. There's a loud ringing sound, like a bell, then a gradual decay as the wire rods continue to move on their own. More than 90 of these sculptures are arranged throughout the barn. Bertoia coined the term "sonambient" to describe them.

When Harry Bertoia's Sonambient label was resurrected, our intention was to tell the story of Bertoia's groundbreaking Sonambient work as revealed through his extensive collection of notes and recordings. When the first new LP was released in 2016 we were only in possession of 1/20th of the archive. Now, in 2019, we're excited to release the first LP of new material from the full archive and we present it to increaseunderstanding of what Bertoia was doing in his sound-barn deep in the Pennsylvania woods.

The recordings contained on this album were selected because of their relationship to Bertoia's body of recorded work. The titles are from from Bertoia's notes which Bertoia placed in each tape box, indicating date and describing briefly. Like his sculptures, Bertoia never titled his recordings but frequently referred to specific concepts he was pursuing. These are among the earliest known examples of Bertoia using terms which would become more common in the years to come: "experimental," "mechanical" and "long sounds." Harry died in 1978

GREEN-HOUSE MUSIC FOR LIVING SPACES

Leaving Records presents Music For Living Spaces, the debut LP by non-binary Los Angeles-based artist Green-House. Olive Ardizoni helms the project, which made its debut with the charming 2019 EP Six Songs for Invisible Gardens. Music for Living Spaces represents an evolution of its predecessor's minimalist compositions into songs that move with winsome melodies and emotional arcs. Though recorded during a pandemic, the transporting nature of Music For Livings Spaces offers a remedy for dreariness. Ardizoni states, "I'm trying to hit that part of the brain that's affected by the emotional state that you're in when you perceive something as cute."

Music For Living Spaces' first single "Sunflower Dance" sports a breezy, bucolic vibe. The track is intended to invoke the whimsical image of hamsters happily dancing in a field. Ardizoni brings an intentionality to these playful atmospheres. They state, "In our culture, we prioritize profound artistic expression through emotions like sadness or aggression, but cuteness, silliness or fun, are the things that we trivialize in our culture.



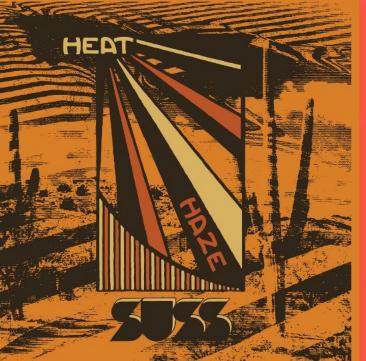




On Night Suite, SUSS led the listener through a dark desert night in the American Southwest, and Heat Haze picks up where that adventure left off – in the blistering light of a new day, where heat waves rise from the ribbon of asphalt unfolding ahead. The architects of the "ambient country" sound, SUSS built the five tracks of Heat Haze with their unique combination of classic Americana instrumentation: pedal steel, National guitar, harmonica, mandolin, baritone guitar and harmonium, interwoven with loops and synthesizers. These tracks, like Night Suite, have personal resonance for the surviving members of SUSS, as they contain music (most notably the title track Heat Haze) recorded with Gary Leib, one of the band's original members, who unexpectedly passed away soon after these tracks were completed. This represents his — and the band's — continued search for an elusive dream on the shimmering horizon.

Luke Schneider was born in Dayton, Ohio in 1980. he was named after Paul Newman's character in the film Cool hand Luke. he cut his teeth playing with artists like Margo Price and Caitlin Rose. A popular session player, he has taken the extraordinary step of transforming himself into a solo artist, the main attraction. Third Man Records put out a new age album. Play this record to find out why.

This recording, which can justifiably be described as "new age" in the most essential sense, represents a radical new approach to the versatile and cosmic instrument of the steel guitar. This is something new under the sun, a total reinvention of an iconic instrument. Quite literally, there has never been anything else quite like it. All of the sounds heard on this album were made with a 1967 Emmons Push/Pull pedal steel guitar by Luke Schneider, a popular session musician in Nashville,

Tennessee. Luke has been an important band member for artists such as William Tyler, Caitlin Rose,

Margo Price, and Orville Peck.

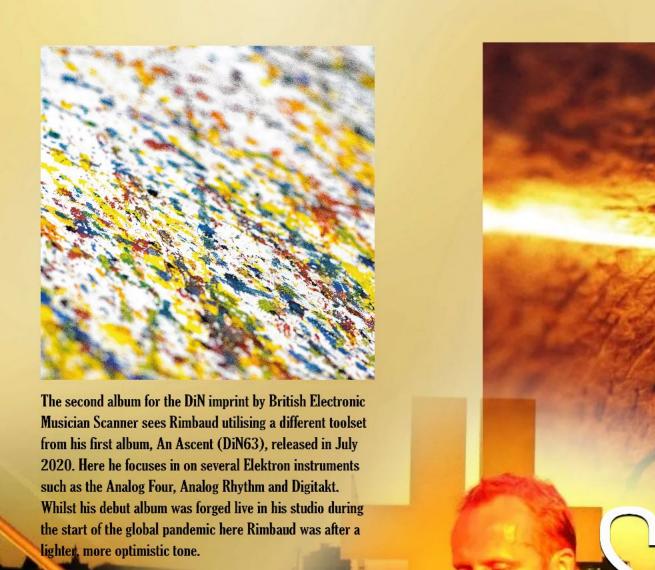

WARIOUS ARTISTS MANIKIN RECORDS THIRD DECADE 2012-2022

Rather prophetically Rimbaud states that this album was indebted to the work of the Ukranian film maker Laris Shepitko. Indeed the title of the sixth track "Artemovsk" references the birth place of Shepitko. Furthermore the title of the album, "The Homeland of Electricity", is taken from her 1968 film which was commissioned by the government to celebrate the October Revolution's 50th anniversary, but was rejected by the authorities for not being patriotic enough. At times the music has a sense of blissful calm such as the opener "You and Me" with layers of texture slowly rising & falling to unveil hidden depths to the soundscape. Rimbaud's love of the human voice as a musical element can be heard in the tracks "Another Aircraft", "Artemovsk" and "At last it moves into silence" albeit with very different sonic outcomes. Fluctuating between darker elements displayed in such tracks as "Air in the Air" and "Beginning of an Unknown Century" in the end the album reveals a sense of hope which is no more apparent in the joyous simplicity of "Acentria". As Rimbaud puts it "this album feels like a sound polaroid of this exact moment in time, capturing our times in atmospheric sound works, where light will be found again, even in the midst

of struggle".
