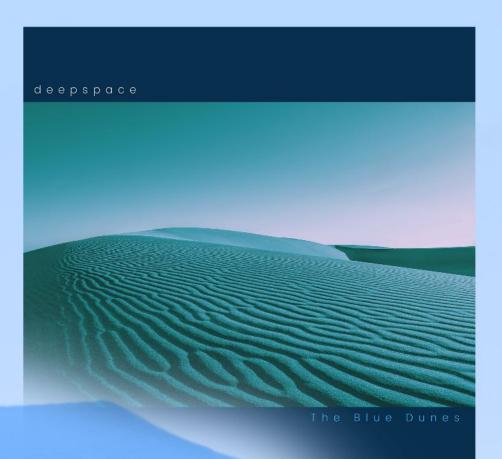
Music inspired by the motion picture

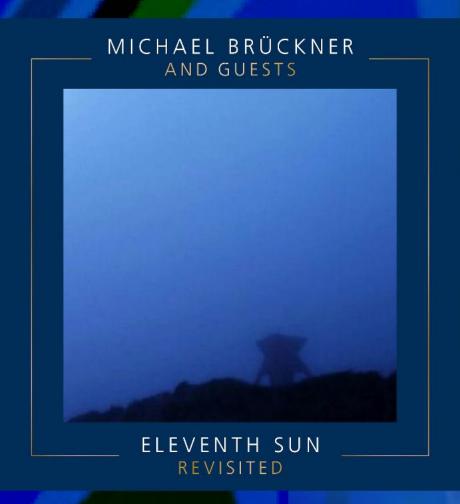
Even though the dunes only appeared blue due to false-colour Imagery indicating temperature, it was enough to kindle the desire for such a surreal place. This desert, with its imagined shadings, is the starting point for Deepspace's hypnotic floating ambience. Longing, desolate shimmers with glassy luminescence abound, interspersed with soft transient murmurs not quite identifiable — maybe the aural representation of a cluster of strangely-shaped rock, or something unusual on the path into a vast and strange terrain. Like a pulsing heatwave, blue chords hover and transform, invoking a halcyon shimmer that sings of the love of solitude and nothingness. Occasionally, some respite from the harsh barren desert occurs as the chords dissipate and clouds form, providing shade from the penetrating sun.

The Blue Dunes, a serene and meditative work from starfaring Australian ambient/electronic artist Deepspace, paints calm and exquisite sound pictures of imagined desert landscapes. Deepspace's second album on Projekt Records contains six floating passages of soft waves inspired by the Odyssey orbiter's 2021 finding of what first seemed to be blue-coloured dunes on Mars. The Blue Dunes takes the aesthetic impact of that discovery and explores a desert bathed entirely in those cool serene hues.

30 years ago, in 1992, Michael Brückner started on his journey as an electronic musician.

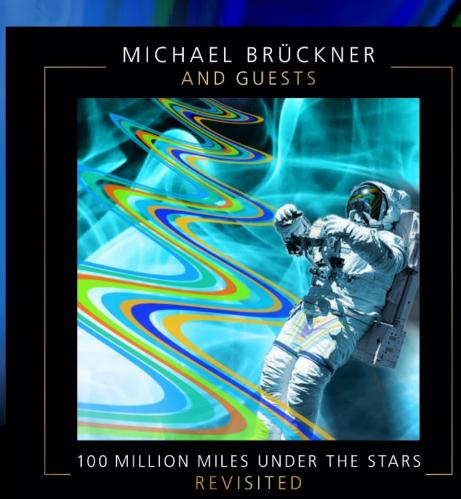

Syndromeda



Order in the Chaos of Life

The 2022 album by Syndromeda, "Order in the Chaos of Life" is a kind of philosophical composition about the threads and challenges of our times facing war, pandemic and individual egoism. Pretty melancholic but soothing melodies appear as well as dynamic sounds in the familiar tunes of Syndromeda.

Metahuman, Sverre Knut Johansen's sixth album for Spotted Peccary, is about looking beyond the arbitrary constructs of ordinary life towards a higher consciousness. Inspired by the Deepak Chopra book of the same name, Metahuman is the search for the best version of oneself, a posing of the question: what are we capable of without the conditional mind?

Johansen renders this reflection in his diverse sonic palette as he traverses the rhythmic and the spacious, the symphonic and the solitary—ever-anchored by a keen sense of melody. He often compares composing to painting, and this compositional philosophy is evident on Metahuman. He adds layer after layer to the canvas, sometimes Berlin School sequences, sometimes a post-rock drumline, until a landscape is wrought from overlapping shades.

Stunning and elegiac, "Human (Path of Destruction)" begins with a wistful arpeggiator rising through a subtle texture. As the piece progresses, tension swells to apocalyptic heights. Mourning drones recall Hans Zimmer's work, the wistful arpeggiator twisting through an expanse of yearning, mourning all that could have been. Percussion carries the piece to swirling crescendo—then detonates like shattering waves. Contrarily, "Metahuman" is calm and pensive. A subtle, trip-hop-esque beat pulses behind a stunning Haken Continuum performance from Ståle Storløkken. "Fluctuations of Awareness," has the essence of the cosmic: distorted warbles cut through steely atmospherics like blips on a radar screen. Like its title suggests, "Fluctuations" never stays in one place for long; a helicopter-like loop thunders through its midsection before dissolving under ethereal waves. Fellow Spotted Peccary artist David Helpling lends shimmering guitar to closer "Infinity Being," the journey ending in a place of peace.

At times yearning and visually imaginative, at times rhythmic and propulsive, Metahuman's nine layered sonic topologies present a master electronic composer at his best

Sébastien Guérive is a composer and sound engineer based in Nantes, France. After studying the cello, he quickly turned to musical creation using computer music, which opened up infinite possibilities for mixing and transforming sound material. Close to the work of a plastic artist, he is as much concerned with the textural aspect of the sound as he is with the melody.

Since 2001 and his first album La Pense Errante composed from collages of samples and "field recording", he continues to develop his personal work (lo'n, Da Sweep ...) and to collaborate on projects for the theatre, dance, soundtracks. For his 2021 album Omega Point, he decided to compose an instrumental album inspired by the form of a sci-fi movie soundtrack.

This new single "Omega VI" is an extension of the album composed during the period of creation of the live show in order to introduce a more rhythmic piece that became the final picture of the live show. This track is composed from a semi-modular synth improvisation around a theme to obtain a heady and atmospheric trance. The presence of analog percussions gives power and a tribal aspect, while still in restraint.

CHRONOS

Original Soundtrack Recording



A RON FRICKE Film | Music Composed and Performed by MICHAEL STEARNS



A soundtrack tuned to the timescales and rhythms of human life on earth

In Greek mythology, "Chronos" is the personification of time. On composer and electronic musical visionary Michael Stearns' 1985 album, Chronos serves as the tempo of a cascade of celestial movements, terrestrial sonic luminance, and morphic electronic harmonies.

Composed as the soundtrack for the IMAX film by cinematographer Ron Fricke (previously of Koyaanisqatsi), these 8 tracks combine to form a continuous 43-minute pandimensional experience, a sensual sound voyage with stops throughout the ancient and modern worlds.

Scored as the film was shot, Stearns' Chronos leads us through earth-bound and aerial spaces, the long plains, the cosmos, the big cities and the tracing of the spiritual and corporeal lights which inform each movement. The symphonic and majestic main theme in "Corridors of Time" hints at vast spaces and soulful longing flowing with cosmic poetry. The track reaches a powerful crescendo resolving in ghostly atmospheres, driving escalator steps and whispered voices. It returns half an hour later, weaving into the themes of the swelling incandescent tapestry of the final two movements.

Chronos opened in 1985 at the Rueben Fleet Space Theater in San Diego, and La Geode in Paris.

Before the opening, I mixed a stereo recording of the soundtrack using Ambisonic surround encoding onto a Mitsubishi X-86 digital recorder. The "Original X-86 Ambisonics Mix" was the source for the 1985 CD and LP release and was remastered for Projekt's CD & digital release.

A second "fold-down mix" was created in 2012 from the 35mm 6 track surround film master. As such, it is not a discrete stereo mix but a rebalancing of the 6 channel print master folded-down into stereo.

In the spring of 2022, Bob Ohlsson remastered both versions of Chronos. The fidelity and dynamic range revealed during this process is fantastic! With digital technology not available back in the day (level, EQ adjustments and further processing), Chronos takes on a vibrant new life; I'm so impressed with the sound of these releases on Projekt. They bring excitement and magic back into the unfolding of this seminal piece of my work.

Blue is Nine, a.k.a. Streamline, a.k.a. Gary Mulford. I'm an ambient post-rock musician from the suburbs of Philadelphia Pa. (New Jersey). Heavily influenced by the music played on local radio shows (WXPN) John Diliberto's 'Echoes' and Chuck Van Zyl's 'Star's End', I became greatly interested in ambient, electronic, eclectic, and jazz fusion music.



CHURCH OF HE'D

Church of Hed is the solo project of the American spacerock band Quarkspace's drummer, synthesist, and producer, Paul Williams. With Quarkspace seemingly in retirement or hiatus, Church of Hed is Williams's main focus. The music involves aural travelogues, inspired by progressive and space rock and Berlin School electronica. Paul plays drums, keyboards, and synthesizers; he composes songs, beats, and loops, and he (thankfully) rarely sings.

Yes, the long wait finally ends with the release of our new album, The Father Road. It takes you on a surreal aural journey across the United States along the Lincoln Highway, the first transcontinental road built for automobiles. It's effectively the sequel to our 2011 album, Rivers of Asphalt, which traveled the legendary Route 66. The music shifts and evolves in tandem with the scenic backdrop of America from San Francisco to New York City. As with the original release, the sense of a lost era lurks throughout the album.

THE FATHER ROAD

The band's Paul Williams composed, performed, and produced The Father Road with help from Quarkspace guitarist, Stan Lyon, on bass and guitar. Williams plays an array of synthesizers, keyboards, and electric drums. Surreal ambience highlights the western portion of the highway, while more lyrical instrumental pieces aurally describe the more populated sections of this old road.
