Many myths about possible life on Mars have kept mankind in motion for eternity.


Thaneco, who was in musical research of ancient tales in Greece so far, now looks at Mars and adds some musical conjectures.

Based on the science fiction novel "Nemesis" by Isaac Asimov.

"The novel is set in an era in which interstellar travel is in the process of being discovered and perfected. Before the novel's opening, "hyper-assistance", a technology allowing travel at a little slower than the speed of light, is used to move a reclusive space station colony called Rotor from the vicinity of Earth to the newly discovered red dwarf Nemesis. There, it takes up orbit around the semi-habitable moon Erythro, named for the red light that falls on it. It is eventually discovered that the bacterial life on Erythro forms a collective organism that possesses a form of consciousness and telepathy (a concept similar to the Gaia of Asimov's Foundation series). While the colonists argue over the direction of future colonization—down to Erythro, or up to the asteroid belts of Nemesis system—events catch up with them. Back on Earth superluminal flight is perfected, ending Rotor Colony's isolation and opening the galaxy to human exploration

You now see the result of my experiment before you.

The fear that many people have about the use of this technology, in my option, comes from the factthat we tend to completely subscribe to a new and more convent way of life without seriously questioning the consequences.

That is a much greater danger than the use of technology itself.

## COSMIC GROUND ENTROPY

Recorded March 2022 to February 2023 performed, mixed and produced at Dom/attic and Castlepark, Aachen by Dirk Jan Müller



Modular systems, Mellotron, 1960s Farfisa organs and analogue string ensembles from the 70s form this music that is 99% electronic in nature, supplemented by some processed self-recorded atmospheres from different environments with some stains of granular synthesis.

The 8 tracks on 'entropy' offer loads of multi-layered sequences combined with real tape echo, guitar, ambient and free format atmospheres to polyphonic organ drones.

Dirk Jan Müller plays analog modular synthesizers and sequencers, vocoder, Rhodes, Farfisa organs, mellotron, Syntorchestra, Solina, Farfisa professional piano, guitar, bass, samples, field recording, and revox.

Cosmic Ground is a solo project by keyboardplayer Dirk Jan Müller, member of psychedelic krautrock band Electric Orange, who brought out many albums in the last 22 years.

Belgian Stratosphere (Ronald Mariën) returns with what could be his deepest album yet. Cyclus, his first full solo release since Rise (2016), ...is a brilliant piece of work, says critic Serge Timmers of luminous-dash.be. "It's a powerful drone-ambient album with a dreamy post-rock feel to it. The magic that this man can create with his guitar, his bass and his pedalboard is quite stunning.

You could say Cyclus is a concept album based on recurring themes, infinite delays, everlasting soundscapes and the strange and unsettling times we live in. This crisis-aftercrisis atmosphere is very present here. Stratosphere's five main themes (interspersed with short intermezzos bridges between the tracks) represent the variety of crises we've lived through the past few years in which one is not completely over before another comes bursting in. You could also say absolutely nothing, just close your eyes and allow yourself to immerse in the sonic world of Stratosphere.

With his elaborate soundscapes, here and there supported by minimal arpeggios, Ronald has created a fascinating ambient album. Not only does Cyclus contain both Stratosphere's shortest and longest track, it also contains loads of emotions. Gloomy emotions. The whole album feels like a musical representation of a grown man quietly weeping. Of course, Ronald Mariën is an absolute master in his trade.

### **Elif Yalvaç** My Heart of Noise




Möller Records has released Icelandic Electronica since 2011. Möller Records exists to provide a platform for Icelandic musicians.

My Heart Of Noise is a collaborative album created by UK-based Turkish musician Elif Yalvaç for the Icelandic label Möller Records. It builds on the music and travels that led to her creating Mountains Become Stepping Stones (NNA Tapes, 2020) with the collaborative composition approach of Green Drift (Expert Sleepers, 2022).

Why 'My Heart Of Noise'? Elif: "I hear music everywhere: in natural sounds, in electronic sounds, mechanical sounds. I want to capture and shape it so others can hear what I hear and experience what I feel. I've spent the last few years trying to make sense of a noisy world. My heart is also noisy, but slowly I learnt to listen to it better. And in this new music, I found that I became its 'heart of noise', through meeting and inviting collaborators from across the Nordic countries, bringing their works together coherently, and finding an emotional centre."

My Heart of Noise "began with a collection of studio and concert recordings from my travels north before the pandemic. It became like a puzzle: I could hear something special, but also that the pieces didn't fit together well or feel complete. The breakthrough came in realising that this project was meant to be more about creation than preservation and that it didn't need to be a literal document any more. It could still be faithful, but instead to the spirit that inspired this music and my travels in the first place, instead of a particular recording. I created new musical starting points and invited artists I met on my travels plus others, asking them to choose one to begin to work with together. Some artists incorporated our previous recordings, others set off in a new direction, while I shaped the pieces and found a way to connect them together."







# the nuses


Sorn in the north of the United Kingdom, I started playing when I was young:

#### Binary Tydes is the third album by AEGYRE the current realization of Nimrod Scott.

Rejoicing with the coming of the New Year this music burst forth in a fountain of creativity in a celebration of the ending of the Pandemic. The scope of the sonic exploration ranges from a track in the E-Grass genre (Cosmic Grass), to a slow Ambient piece without tempo (Santamasa Planet) and several points in between! The track Who Has Got The Time? opens with a strong (accidental I promise!) similarity to some sounds from a show featuring a famous time traveler. Nachtwatch (Night Watch) sequentially pursues the swing of the stars on a cloudless night. The title track Binary Tydes is a sweeping story of the forces that control not merely our physical planet but also our human psyche. Synthesizers and sequencers celebratethe gravitational/psychological/spiritual tidal forces that both swing our Solar System and also impact our wondering heart, mind and soul.
