



computerchemist is the ongoing solo project of Dave Pearson, a British-Hungarian musician who lives in Székesfehérvár, Hungary. Pearson's love of electronic music started as a teenager when he first heard Tangerine Dream's Cloudburst Flight.

During the early 1980s he played synthesiser in a number of rock bands, including Lichfield UK-based Monteagle with founder Mark Thwaite as

well as simultaneously composing his own solo music.

Since 2006 he has issued a nurmerous Studio albums on his own label "Terrainflight", and many compilations and collaborations from 2009. His music has been likened to "Berliner Schule/Berlin School style jazz-rock".

Hot on the heels of the excellent "mysterious cave of eternal theta" comes this latest release from computerchemist. The opener "twilight trail" sets the scene with some super BS sequencing, including the requisite ratcheting, as well as big pad sounds, electric piano, mellotron strings and a nicely over-driven lead guitar which puts in an appearance with some laid-back drums to create a rich Berlin School track with a rocky edge. A wonderful way to spend 11 minutes and 21 seconds.

The mood is changed with the appearance of "berlin school for 4 pianos No 1" which as you might guess, sounds like the interaction of 4 pianos, each playing BS type sequences. Quite experimental and ultimately successful.

Berlin School 'normality' returns with "testcard" which at over 15 minutes proves to be the longest track on the album. The funky feel to the arrangement pushes the track to the edges of BS but all the ingredients are still there, including sequences, mellotrons and synthesisers. Together with drums, it proves to be one of the more lively tracks and includes an annoyingly effective earworm that will attract you back again and again.

The title track "green twilight" starts in an atmospheric vein but together with a 'tribal' feel rhythm and some heavy sounding synthesiser chords it builds slowly to a crescendo before acquiescing to some evocative choirs and distant animal howls. An excellent track and worthy of its pole position for the album title crown.

The return of "berlin school for 4 pianos" but this time as "No 2" again showcases the style and moves forward from those ideas in "No 1" using Berlin School style sequences on pianos. Again, quite experimental and ultimately successful.

With soaring lead synthesisers, guitars, mellotrons and drums, the grand finale is provided by "the magnetism of thought", the most rock oriented track on the album and a fitting closure to this journey through the Berlin School world of the album.

Although still firmly rooted in the Berlin School genre, "green twilight" moves into rockier sounding territory than its predecessor had occupied. However, the quality of the recording is still as high as ever and the variation between tracks provides interest that will demand many repeat listenings.

He formed Monster Taxi and Toy Robot Records to license his own tracks to major labels. The Monster Taxi tunes, "Boogie Makes a Splash" and "Cosmic Love Juice", were featured on a dance compilation for Ministry of Sound, He worked with Billboard charting dance singers such as Pepper Mashay (Cosmic Love Juice), Rachel Pamay (Repeat Performance and Get Off), Jennifer Carbonell (Memory Wack), and Ray Guell (Love is the Answer).

Monster Taxi is the alter-ego of Miami music producer and keyboardist Jason Klein. Klein has worked on recordings for several major and indic artists including Mariah Carey, Ricky Martin, and Earth Wind & Fire.


Matt is a relatively new composer on the scene but has a long history in the music business. Having gained invaluable insights by working for independent labels in Europe in the 90s, he returned to Australia in the early 00s where he began singing on the local circuit. In 2014, he joined Australia's largest Pink Floyd tribute act Echoes of Pink Floyd as lead vocalist and tours nationwide.

INNER - COSMOS

Now Matt adds another string to his bow by diving into the electronic music scene with the release of "Inner Cosmos". Matt taps into his love of classic ambient/electronic artists like Tangerine Dream, Klaus Schulze, Brian Eno, Cluster, John Carpenter and Vangelis to weave a collection of mini soundtracks for the mind's eye.

Many of the pieces on the album felt like soundtracks to imaginary movies in my mind. Some were even inspired by existing movies. "Inner Cosmos" is a beautiful, atmospheric and sometimes dark excursion into our own inner cosmic realm, at times unpredictable yet full of warmth and wonder.

Electronic, modular music

"Ever since I was eight, I've been interested in electronic music, mostly inspired by Jean-Michel Jarre's Oxygene. This music was on the radio every day. I played an electronic organ at home, but somehow these sounds weren't what I was looking for. When I discovered a synthesiser, I started reading about it and became familiar with sound synthesis and signal processing. At sixteen, I bought my first own synthesizer."


At the age of 20, he completed his musical education and passed his exams (general music theory, piano and keyboard, ear training, analogue sound synthesis and music history). He has always been interested in music theory and discovered that there was always much more to learn.

During the '90s, he was involved in various production projects ranging from house to new-age music, mostly electronic and sometimes performed live with classical instrumentalists.

In 2008, Ricardo used the name Tectonia for the first time for an art project he was involved with. When it comes to modular synthesizers, nothing else has thrown him off his stride because everything he'd ever learned about music composition just didn't fit anymore. The modular synthesizer forced him to think and react completely differently. Though intimidating at times, the feel he gets from modular synths is often very liberating. "The modular synthesizer gives me the feeling of freedom."

"My mission is to keep learning, to tame the 'beast' in the modular synth and to put the resulting beeps and bloops into a musical context that provides an enjoyable l istening experience. It's a bit like telling a story with music, like painting with tones. I make electronic, modular, ambient soundtracks." The modular synthesizer is totally different from the way you think and react.

The solo creation of Elmar Schulte, these eight electronic/tribal-flavoured tracks look into barren, desolate and desert landscapes displaying sincere admiration for the music of Steve Roach. (Steve joins Elmar on one track, "Quiet Earth;" the follow-up Solitaire release, RITUAL GROUND, would be a full collaboration between Schulte & Roach.) This highly atmospheric recording sees the classic Germanic-electronic influence of the ALTERED STATES debut morph in favour of ethnic, rhythmic sounds ("Rhythm of the Stones") and darker, textural, slow ambient movements ("Anasazi" and "Secret Ceremony.") PLAINS AND SKIES breathe the mystery and the air of wide-open, deserted places in a minimal, immersive fashion with organic elements underneath, at times tapping the well of ritual-related soundscape music.

The term musical alchemist best describes modern music composer Robert Scott Thompson. Combining his mastery of the electroacoustic, contemporary instrumental, and avant-garde genres into a swirling cohesive whole, he is an important pioneer on music's new frontier. Hailed as one of the most important composers working in electroacoustic, acousmatic and classical ambient music today, he has produced and published seminal work since 1976. Influences as diverse as Chopin and Satie, Stockhausen, Varèse and Cage, and Bowie and Eno can be heard in Robert's music. Robert's first love is the electronic music synthesizer, but he is also an expressive vocalist, instrumentalist, video artist, computer musician, sound designer, and film composer.


DRAGGING THE SEA WITH DREAMS

Trying to write about the music of Robert Scott Thompson in any meaningful way is, for me, like recounting a long, vivid, and emotionally moving dream to someone else, whether close friend or complete stranger: a venture inevitably doomed by a variety of obstacles.

Dreams are very personal. Our dreams are filled with symbols, images, emotional triggers, and memories, all of which only hold meaning for the dreamer; any attempt to translate that experience into language is inevitably accompanied by a sense of the absurd, of

hopelessness. William S. Burroughs once described our attempts to relay our dreams to others this way: "For years I wondered why dreams are so often dull when related, and this morning I find the answer, which is very simple - like most answers, you have always known it: No context ... like a stuffed animal set on the floor of a bank."



DRAGGING THE SEA WITH DREAMS



Stefana Fratila is a Romanian-born artist, composer and sound designer based in Toronto, Canada Between December 2018 and 2019, Fratila embarked on a series of research trips across North America (including to NASA Jet Propulsion Laboratory and NASA Goddard Space Flight Centre), meeting with astronomers and scientists in order to address a complex question: "If each planet in our solar system were a different room, what would each room sound like?"

Her ongoing creative research culminated in Sononaut, eight open-source VST plug-ins created for digital audio workstations (DAWs) that emulate the atmospheric conditions of the planets in our solar system (made in collaboration with artist Jen Kutler, using calculations by NASA astronomer and planetary scientist Dr Conor Nixon).

During a residency at CMMAS (Centro Mexicano para la Música y las Artes Sonoras) in Morelia, Mexico, Fratila began writing the album on an octophonic sound system. Afterwards, from her home studio in Toronto, she recorded additional synthesizer parts, finalized arrangements, and incorporated Sononaut into the album's production.


RECONFIGURING THE LANDSCAPE

Reconfiguring the Landscape was an artistic research project investigating how 3-D electroacoustic composition and sound art can evoke and provoke a new awareness of our outdoor sound environment.

The integration of art and technology was central to the investigation that focused on sound, space, time and the utility of outdoor areas. The ideas were tested in artistic creations, and during a three-year period, Natasha Barrett created a series of site-specific outdoor sound installations. These works were installed in public spaces for durations ranging from a few days to a few months.

The tracks on this CD are remixes of three installations and one two-part work that hovers in between installation and concert format. They are composed from the installation materials and unmodified site-specific recordings and intend to capture the immersive personal listening experience of 'being there'.

Steeped in rigorous classical training, Copely's performance career began at an early age: by fourteen, she performed a full solo tour of the British Isles, and continued to gain attention in the classical world by winning Bronze Medal in the 1st USA International Harp Competition, debuting as concerto soloist at Carnegie Hall and Lincoln Center soon after.
