E-Scape 2020 is a collection of exclusive tracks from artists scheduled to perform at E-Scape 2020 which was cancelled due to Covid-19. The festival was to have been a charity event in aid of MENCAP and so proceeds from the E-Scape 2020 album are being donated to the charity along with monies collected through a Just Giving page. E-Scape 2020 is a varied collection of spacey electronic music combined with some gently rhythmic sequencer offerings that flow effortlessly as a cohesive, and very chilled, electronic music album.

The Garwin Project opens with the Pink Floyd inspired Cloudburst. Next up is Volt with the gently upbeat Strands of Tranquility before lan Boddy presents his ominously rhythmic remix of Shrine.

Carys presents her first solo EM piece, the darkly evocative Veni, Vidi, Lacrimavi, before The Garwin Projects return with his second offering, a great slice of UK electronica, Run Four. House of Chimes by Robert Fox slows things right down again, but then Sigh by Ron Boots picks things up with another gently rhythmic, sequencer inspired track.

Next up is Code Indigo with a slice of previously unreleased contemporary chill-out music, MeltDown (The Chill-Out Remix). Volt returns with the gorgeous Kinematic Star and David Wright closes the album with the optimistic Stars Dream On.

Already back in 2018, after a concert with Volker and our friend, synthesist and electronic composer Bernhard Wöstheinrich in Berlin, I recorded the basic tracks for "Segmented Visions", however due to various other commitments, the project was put on the backburner for some time, only to be resumed and finished in 2020.

Compared to its predecessor, "Monsoon Offerings" (with our guest Suzannah Moon), "Segmented Vision" features a wider variety (10 shorter tracks instead of 3), on the other hand it can be seen as one long composition in ten parts.

The mood turned a bit more sombre or pensive in places - which may seem suitable in the light of the dramatic event of a pandemic dominating the bigger part of everyone's life on the planet.

However, the music was finished before the full impact of Covid 19 hit our part of the world.

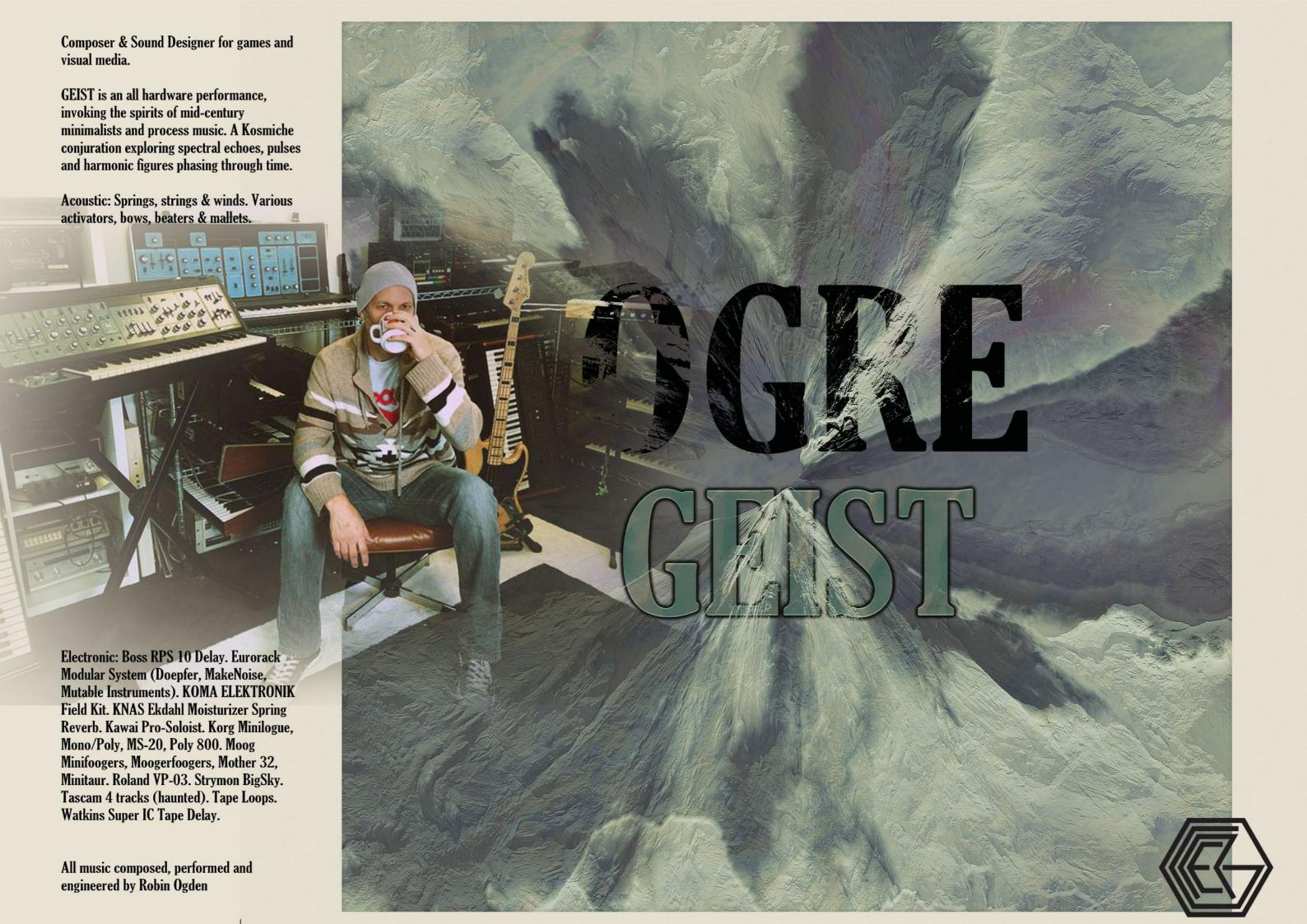


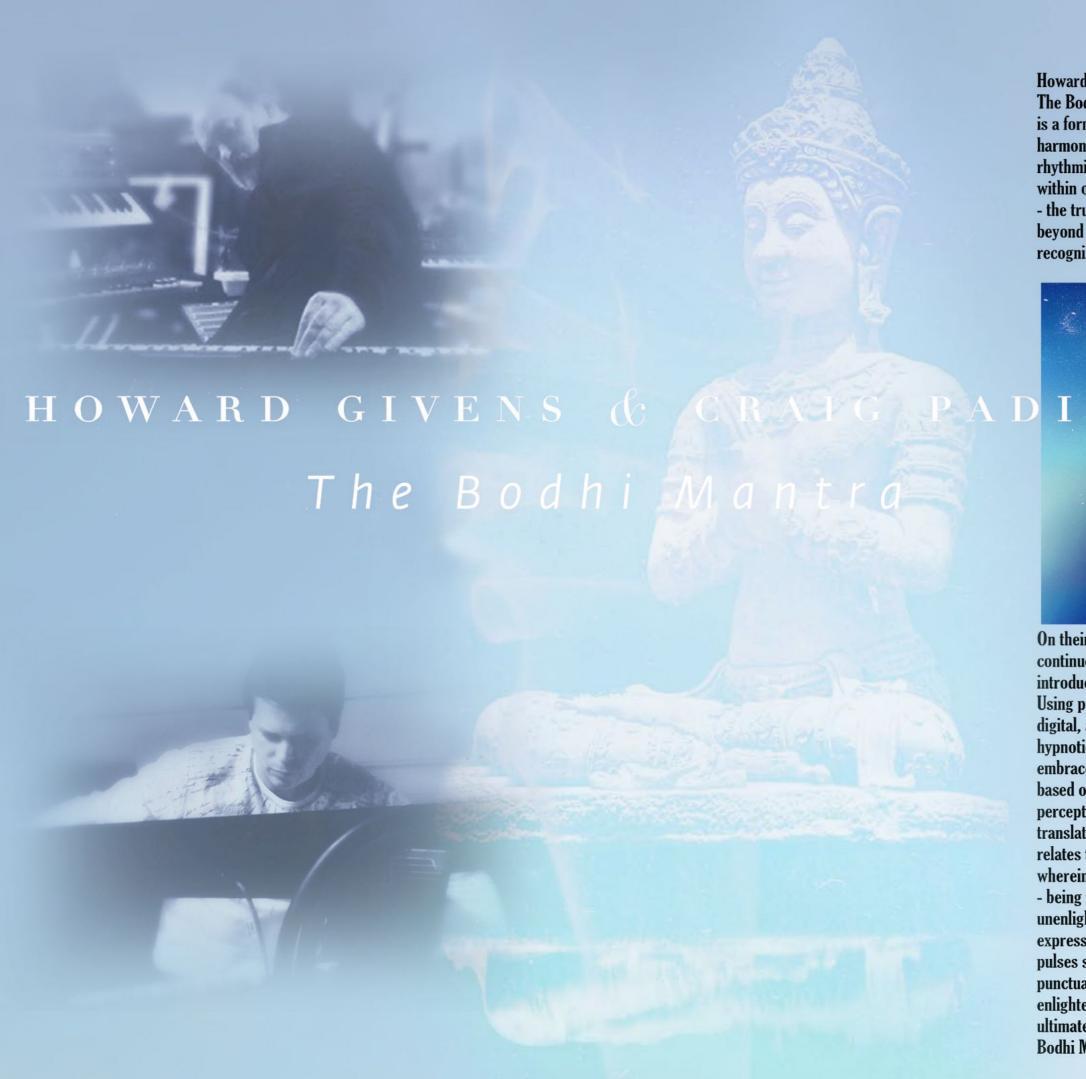
Segmented Vision

On their third collaboration, Givens and Padilla continue a musical journey that follows the concepts introduced in their previous album, Being of Light. Using pure organic tones within their many analog, digital, and modular synthesizers, this duo has created hypnotic and meditative music to stir the heart, embrace the soul, and free the mind; music that is based on their appreciation of experiencing the perception of consciousness. Bodhi is a Sanskrit word translated as "enlightenment" or "awakening" which relates to a Buddhist concept of spiritual awareness, wherein Bodhi is synonymous with the state of nirvana - being freed from hate, greed and ego or the unenlightened identity. The Mantra is the musical expression of this serene offering. Delicate, breath-like pulses set an intention of mindful solemnity, punctuated by moments of fulfillment and enlightenment, and underlining discovery of the ultimate relationship with the one true self. This is The Bodhi Mantra.

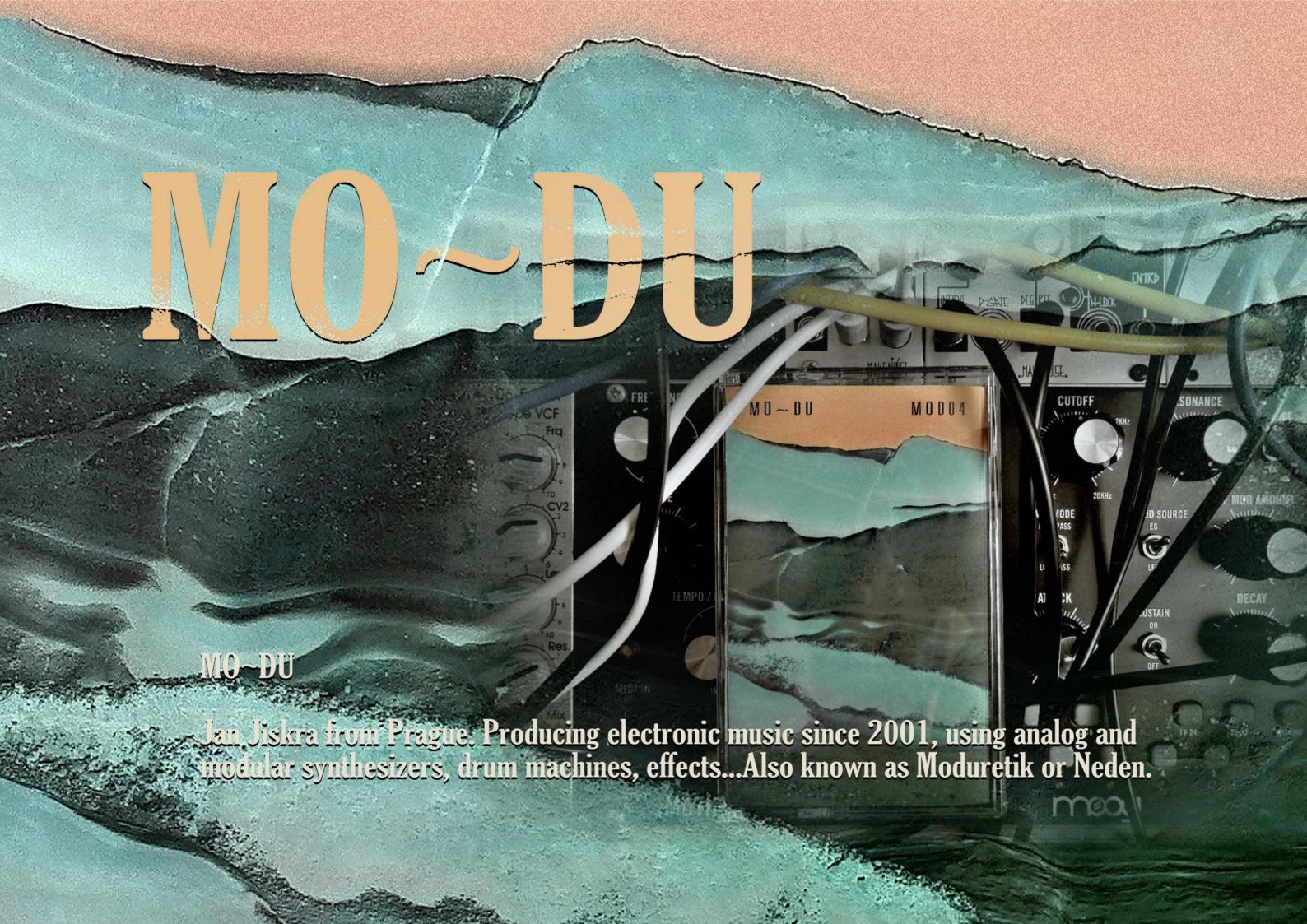
JESSICA MOSS

Jessica Moss has been blossoming as a solo artist since the release of her acclaimed debut album Pools Of Light in spring 2017. The violinist, composer and singer best known for her fifteen-year tenure in political post-punk band Thee Silver Mt. Zion is newly ascendant as a soloist, captivating audiences with gritty, warmly expressive electronic- and drone-inflected post-classical Minimalism (and sometimes Maximalism), accented by a distinctive melodic sensibility that channels Klezmer, Balkan and Middle Eastern tropes.

Moss has played 80 shows in the past year, including appearances at Big Ears, WSO New Music, Le Guess Who?, Zemlika and Supersonic, participation in multiple editions of Basilica Hudson's 24-Hour Drone Fest, and a mix of headlining dates and opening slots for the likes of Zu, BIG|BRAVE (on whose most recent album she also plays), and labelmates Godspeed You! Black Emperor.

Entanglement On Entanglement, her new and second album, Moss channels quantum theory as a metaphor for creating energetic connections through esoteric processes. Using violin (and occasionally, voice) as sound source, her compositions are set in motion like entangled particles — spinning, ricocheting, warping and stretching in extra-dimensional space





Finding myself tasked with the RS5 write-up just after having separated a maimed bird from one of the cats, first thing, before even coffee... Well at least 5-Alpha should get you awake! It has a slow techno beat and hops along just like that bird doesn't, anymore. The two driving

sequences don't sound entirely in key together, but then nothing else much sounds entirely in key either! But it works just fine and in spite of the bounce, the piece still retains a chilled slow-burn feel.

The rest of RS5 isn't workout music :-D

I wanted to say that Electronica, especially the long, murky, dark pieces with muddy sequences, designed to build certain moods etc... this stuff is a bitch to master. It's important frequencies are wide-band and unpredictable, with a huge dynamic range. Thankfully, the wonders of modern technology bring forth such things as decent multi-band compression. This is proving invaluable in emphasising rhythms and just keeping it all in context, bass particularly. I've also found it quite important to listen in mono while final mix/mastering. There's a very wide stereo field and if things are slowly phasing around, ya might hear holes!!! Now, we don't need those, especially on the bass, so mono sniffs those out, along with any other weirdness which pops out of nowhere. Hehe.. so it kinda takes a while to balance out the consequences of the day's work so that it sounds about the same through different speakers and doesn't cause any lasting harm to either them or to you ;-)

Greetings, fellow travellers of the Great Bullshit Continuum.

RadioSilence No.6 is here with more wibbly-woogly throbbiness, designed, in essence, to do pretty much nothing in actual fact except be wibbly-woogly throbbiness. Is RadioSilence an art-form? Is it a subliminal expression of deep thoughtfulness from the bowels of the primordial universe? Is it f*ck as like.

Ees simples... I program ze synfs, ze synfs make pretty noises for me, I turn ze knobs, blend ze sounds and then I adhere to Pink Floyd Rule No.1: pile on many more layers and I'll be seeing you there! Except I don't pile on too many more layers because that would just be silly. Or an Andy Pickford album :-D

Anyway, you'll notice that three of these four pieces do shift at a kind of slow techno rate. Well, I thought given the lockdown and fair weather you might feel rather energetic. But then I realised how many of you are as addled and knackered as I am, so I slowed it down to reduce the risk of harmful consequences.

RadioSilence remains Andy Pickford still being arty-farty and possibly failing miserably but who cares it's fun :-)

Welcome to RadioSilence! This is a new Electronic Ambient project from Andy Pickford. This kind of music is perfect for relaxation and meditation... or in my case "napping", in which case I'd say it's ideal for soothing the furrowed brow of many a grumpy old git! Composition, production and photography by David Mason.

"Devoid of beats and obvious rhythms, pieces like 'Sapling Three' rely on a languid form of forward motion, buzzing with latent energy and overlapping, effervescent arpeggios. With the addition of soft reverb and subtle modulations and a coda filled with urgent bass sequences, these pieces take on a melodic intricacy without ever sounding anything other than minimalistic...The album is punctured by three short, sub-one minute vignettes, wrapping complete and intense emotion in the briefest of statements. While 'Sad Center' has a profoundly moving quality, the wonderful 'Interior Hue' is a classically-leaning piece nodding contentedly in the direction of early electronic albums and the long shadow cast by their innovative sound palettes."
