# Corey Holms Vestige House

Recorded on various fixed and modular analog gear during a particularly gloomy and rainy winter in Jamestown, Washington 2020.

Having worked over a month without a single day off from my primary occupation as a graphic designer, all of the days started blending together. This music was made as an escape and coping mechanism (something to help my mind pull focus), but ironically ends up being something well suited to listen to while working.

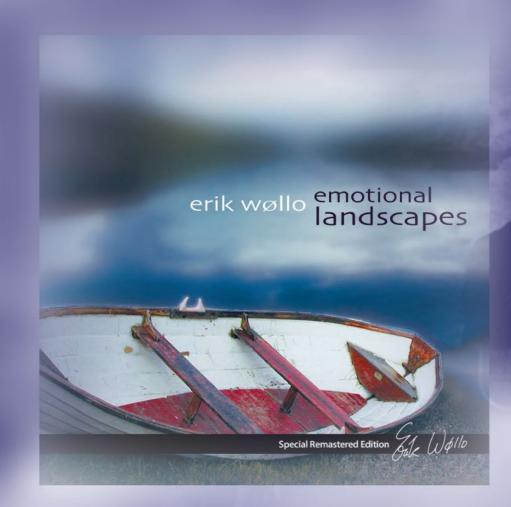
Written and recorded in off hours, piecemeal — the patch would be left on the modular for days, waiting to be picked back up again. By the nature of analog modular, when I would go back to it there were tiny differences. There's always differences. And you can't go back; what has been recorded is all there is, even with patch notes you can't get back to where you were. So you just continue, find the pulse, find the pattern and let that guide the process. Sometimes it's seamless, other times you can hear that a day or more has passed. Time became a theme for this recording as the entire release uses a time-offset composition technique where notes will play, the come back delayed at various rates, which end up creating countermelodies. So this mixture of what is now and what was then ends up weaving together into melodic strands held in place by a clock. Pattern exploration and manipulation — natural cycles of starting slowly then a flurry of activity all leading to the eventual wind down. The work is palindromic in its nature. Complexity emerging from simplicity, and collapsing back on itself, Ouroboros like.





## erik wølle emotional landscapes





Remastered in 24-bit clarity from the original mixes, Erik Wøllo's long out of print classic album, Emotional Landscapes, is now available as a special remastered edition download-only release.

This tenth solo album is one of Wollo's most popular works, capturing an all-encompassing moment in his recording career where reflections of the past mingle with hints of what lies ahead. Following the success of 2001's Wind Journey, Wollo's skills and unmistakable sound are in top form as he continues to explore the moodier musical territory that he discovered on that groundbreaking album. Emotional Landscapes shows Wollo's creativity clearly focused in the present moment and looking to the future. But he also gives a nod to his roots as the tracks "Second Totem" and "Mountain Beach" use elements and samples from his earlier works — glimpses of the past viewed through the lens of a changing world.

Emotional Landscapes is an elegant work where Erik Wøllo offers an intricate musical expression of the imaginary terrain of the mind. With its deep floating ambiences, infused with the unique vitality of his guitars and electronics, Emotional Landscapes is an essential album in Erik Wollo's musical journey, offering a magnificent sonic vista waiting to be discovered...again

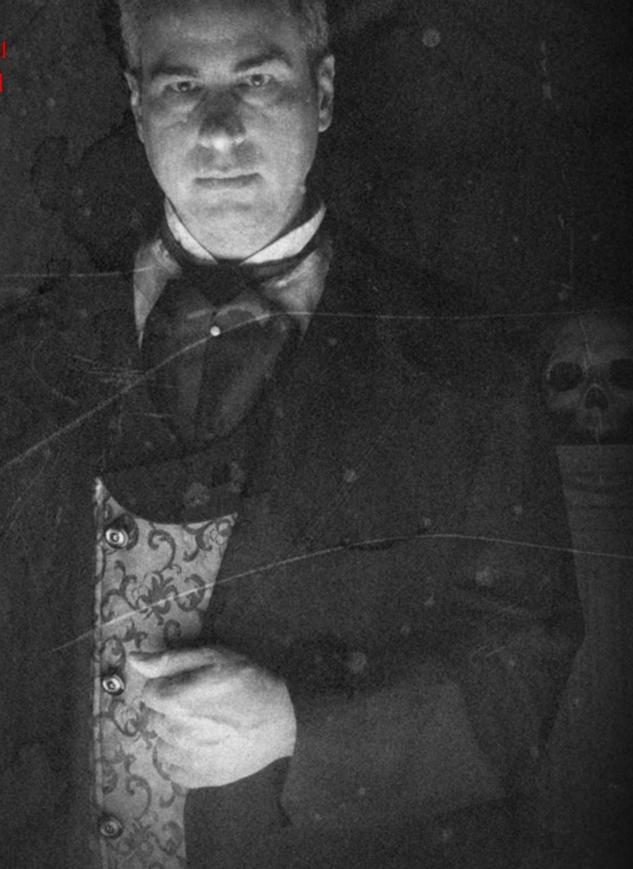

Regulator Records is a record label from Portugal.

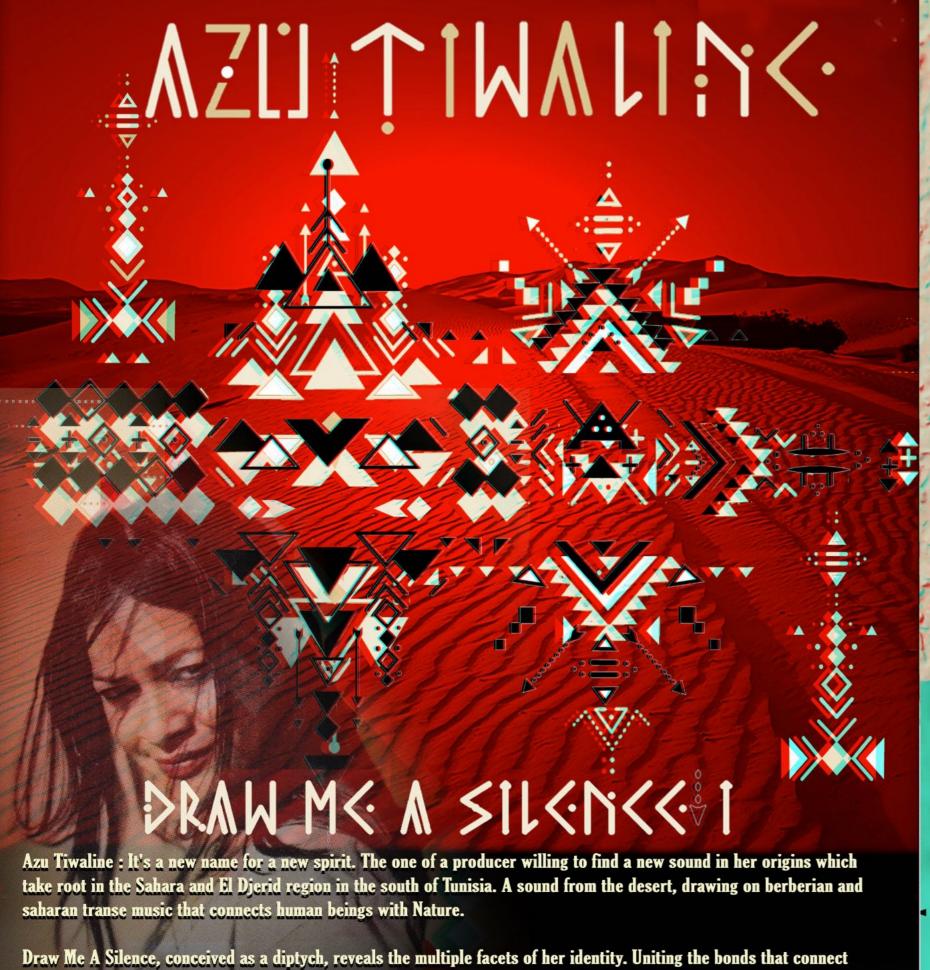
Our main focus is to work with and invest in artists that mean something to us, regardless of how they sound or their potential "market value".

Hanami, Bonifácio's solo debut. is deeply inspired by the experience of a Portuguese alienist in Japan. It was there that he sought inspiration, beauty, balance and simplicity. It was from there that he brought the incentive to record a handful of edifying and unpretentious songs, just as he sees each day.

Born in Ovar, based in Porto,

Bonifácio is a musician and producer with a compulsion for self-challenge. Each composition represents a new approach without a motherboard in the way it wants to show us the world.





Draw Me A Silence, conceived as a diptych, reveals the multiple facets of her identity. Uniting the bonds that connect Berber music, dub culture and techno hypnosis, Azu Tiwaline invites us to refocus on our senses and our nature. She knows how to use contrasts between light and the invisible, exploring the complexity of our emotions and the mystery that emanates from them, in a polyrhythmic chiaroscuro that runs through each one of her tracks, and of which we discover, as we go along, all the outlines.

### WAGNER



If you've ever reached for a tray of ice and found nothing but half-frozen puddles of H2O, then you're on the way to understanding the dynamics at play on Statea. With a tense sound that hovers directly in between the acoustic and digital realm, pianist Vanessa Wagner and producer Murcof make a moving case for minimalism across classical and ambient music. They also draw parallels between long-dead folks like Erik Satie and Kanye West's favorite Aphex Twin song—timeless stuff, really.

Murcof's music is sparse, minimalist, sample-based electronica. Although founded on complex, at times, abstract, glitchy electronic percussion, Corona's recordings are more melodic and traditionally structured than many contemporary electronic musicians. Many recordings feature orchestral strings sampled from recordings of works by modern composers such as Arvo Pärt.

### Vanessa Wagner

Described by the daily Le Monde as "the most delightfully peculiar pianist of her generation", Vanessa Wagner pursues a career in her image, original and committed, mixing classical recitals, contemporary creation, the practice of ancient instruments, the music of room and the most unusual encounters with video, electronic music, dance.

His rich discography, which covers a large part of the repertoire for piano, has been repeatedly rewarded by the press.

Since winning music in 1999, she has appeared all over the world, as a soloist or with orchestra, and in major festivals, regularly invited by halls that are faithful to her.

Since 2010 she has been the director of the Chambord Festival, where she has developed an eclectic program and has been named Chevalier des Arts et Lettres.



Margaret Harmer: This superb album carries classical reinterpretations with style and innovation. The minimalist piano pieces are brought into a new light, infused with electronic ambient tracks that englobe the piano rather than just extracting a sampling snippet. Murcof's style shinning through all of the composer's works making this a very meaningful album of dialogue between neo-classism, contemporary, minimalism, ambient, electronic music possible today.

### The Pale Blue Dot

Currently, Terry lives near the ocean in Florida. Nichols refers to his music style as "a mixture of cinematic, new age, and minimalist classical," and he names Philip Glass, John Adams, Nils Frahm, George Crumb and Hal Budd as influences, as well as soundtrack composers Hans Zimmer, Ennio Morricone, and John Barry. Terry's first album, At Peace Beneath the Shade of My Father's Tree, was nominated for Best Neo-Classical Album in 2016 by Zone Music Reporter and Best Piano With Instrumentation by One World Radio. His 2017 release, the concept album We Have Only Come To Dream (featuring guest vocalist Rebekah Eden) was born out of Terry's interests in political activism, anthropology, and history. The theme of the album is to portray, musically, the assorted peoples who have journeyed to the Americas through time, from the ancient to the early 20th century.

Of the album, Dyan Garris of NewAgeCD.com wrote "We Have Only Come To Dream. . . a collaboration between Terry Lee Nichols and Rebekah Eden, is ultra-rich, deep, wide, vast, and an utterly gorgeous album through and through.

The Pale Blue Dot is his third album, containing highly-cinematic tracks reflecting Terry's interest in music, history/anthropology, and astrophysics.

The Pale Blue Dot was the brainchild of famed astronomer, science communicator and Voyager imaging team member Carl Sagan, who first proposed snapping Earth with Voyager cameras in 1981. Earth was one of the last things Voyager 1 saw.

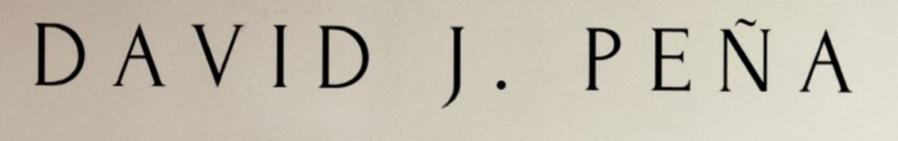

David J. Peña is a drummer, composer, and multi-instrumentalist raised in Mission, TX and based in the Dallas/Fort Worth area whose compositions conjure vast worlds and cinematic visions through their evocative soundscapes and imaginative development.

Peña's musical career has explored various genres, including Contemporary Christian, Lite Rock, and New Age Instrumental, and has drawn influence from icons such as Jim Brickman, Yanni,

James Horner, and Hans Zimmer. What distinguishes Peña is that his music is not merely a conglomeration of its constituent parts; rather, he carefully pulls distinct strands from each and masterfully weaves them into a tapestry that displays the craftsman's artistry without diminishing the integrity of the materials from which it was made.

"Thinking of You" does not only create a musical tapestry, but successfully wraps listeners in a carefully woven world of dramatic scenes, vibrant images, and abounding creativity.

Featuring songs composed by David J. Peña and arranged for orchestra by Judah Earl, based entirely upon Peña's cinematic vision for each piece, "Thinking of You" is a true collaboration. During the composition process, Peña would describe the scene upon which the in-progress song was based before Earl heard the song itself. In this way, both individuals added their own flair to the music, and had a unified vision for each piece. As Peña describes it, he would create the body of work, and Earl would "breathe life into it" by scoring and arranging the work for orchestra to achieve its full cinematic potential.
