



With POV2: The Case For Square Waves While Searching For Happy Accidents Peter Grenader, Steve Roach and Miles Richmond have ushered a new departure from their first release, returning to their Westcoast minimalist roots while testing a wide pallet of sonic possibilities - from ethereal timbral pastures to biting, hard hitting fury.

The thrust of POV was to sculpt a multi-timbral sonic landscape forged from a confluence of sound sources, The sonic food chain began from a core of electric and processed guitar via a modular synthesizer equipped with both standard and granular sampling capability. The infusions of flute and acoustic piano are on tap for further boundary pushing as are a few essential analog synths both virtual and vintage. Ultimately it's about the music itself, The point of view provided here is yours to experience, open to a myriad of interpretations.

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
In early 2015, Tangerine Dream founder Edgar Froese passed away. Like many, I too was shocked by losing one of the founding fathers and main inspirations of the music we love!

A few weeks later, a friend who hosted a radio show - Christian Fiesel -

invited me to contribute a track for an Edgar Froese tribute show that he


was putting together. At first I hesitated, for I usually don't do tribute tracks and felt that this were shoes to big to wear for me. However, he persuaded me to give it a try, and the result was the central track on this album - "Everlasting Footprints" (a title that has the initials EF!). Another month later, I was asked to contribute to yet another memorial radio show - and for that purpose created several alternative mixes of that track. One of them is included in this album as well (but not the one that was aired). The two versions of "Everlasting Footprints" are quite different, and I guess it's worth having them both! At the time, I didn't want to include these tracks on an album, because it would have felt like capitalizing on Edgar's passing. But more than five years later, it seems appropriate to finally release this music. Of course, I didn't stop recording music since 2015, and in 2018 and 2019, I was yet again invited to contribute to different compilations which were specifically dedicated to Berlin School. Like it sometimes happens, these projects were never released - which turned out as a blessing in disguise, because this is just the music I needed to complement "Everlasting Footprints" and assemble this album - which I'd like to dedicate to the memory of Edgar Froese.

'Sentences' is the second single from Digitonal's much anticipated third studio album, 'Set the Weather Fair', due for release on 23rd October.

Henry Purcell's 'March' from his 'Funeral Sentences' originally composed in 1695 for the State Funeral of Queen Mary has been recontextualised many times, most notably by both Wendy Carlos in her original Clockwork Orange score, and also by proto-trance act Cygnus X's as their 'Orange Theme'.

Digitonal's inspired take on this soars and swells, starting and ending with Dobson's exquisite piano playing, enhanced further by the tender and delicate sounds of his clarinet. The whole track builds up into a wide and beautiful expanse of sound before finally quietly falling back into exquisite fragility. It gives us a sense of solemnity and stateliness - there is a depth and loveliness here - the music is utterly beautiful.

"I love the way ambient music continues to evolve into the broadest of churches. For me, it's about wordless expression, in the same way that abstract art can evoke more emotion than the figurative."



LAZY PLUTO 'SUNKEN'



"I was inspired by watching Chicago Footwork after attending Bass Coast, a small festival on the west coast of Canada. I'm super inspired by futuristic and spacey sounds, I always try to bend genre's so that I can attempt an undefinable classification."

The primary alias of Jade Krogh-Mantle, Lazy Pluto, has been credited with some of the least predictable, least classifiable electronic music in Canada.

Although rhythmic and dance floor worthy, this track's primary form takes on the immersion of a Transcendental Meditation. With a driving mantra present throughout, it works through different pockets of your mind; surfacing, making sense of and setting free buried thoughts, while always returning to the propulsive sedation of this motif.

Since debuting modestly in 2014 under the alias Kaboko, Lazy Pluto has juggled a diverse array of inspirations, including early-'80s funk and electro, art rock, raw and classicist house, and Dubstep, while putting a fresh spin on the forms to decayed, disorienting effect.

"Ambient music is something that can be used as a tool, I'll often use ambient music for meditative purposes, you can create such an interesting emotional sensation with this genre, it's beautiful and relatively unexplored."

Into eternal darkness.




ARGYRE PLANITIA
