It all started with an urge to play with sound and a desire to know more.

After several years buried in books, manuals, patch cables and messing with a DIY synth, Jako Jako (real name Sibel Ko er) was playing her first live sets in Berlin, spending every spare cent on Eurorack modules. The passion soon became all-consuming, and in 2017, she left her nursing career to work at Berlin's synth shop institution Schneiders Laden. Here, she's been sharing her grasp of tools and techniques with the city's music-maker community.

The technique is no use without ideas to apply it to fortunately,Jako Jako has a natural curiosity.
"When you hear a sound in an environment, say a car passing by, you don't appreciate the complexity until you think how you might synthesize it," Jako Jako explains. "Then it becomes something abstract, a collection of modulated pitches and timbres. I love to listen to the world like this."

In the late 2000s, a sprawling catalogue of what is now genre-defining music was emanating from an unlikely place. Cleveland, Ohio, has a broad reputation for many things, but in the aughts, psyche-expanding Kosmische wasn't necessarily Cleveland's calling card... until Emeralds. The trio of John Elliott, Steve Hauschildt, and Mark McGuire had released a profusion of limited-run cassettes, CD-Rs, and vinyl titles that had been passed around basement shows and then migrated to niche music communities online, creating a unique kind of murmur, even in the height of the DIY blog era. Three kids from the rust belt were crafting a distinctive and truly far-out strain of music on their own terms in the Midwest. They were flipping lids in wood-panelled basements and circulating around the underground with soaring sounds stylistically indebted to deep German electronic music pioneers and released with the ethos and twisted fervour of renegade Midwestern noise freaks. After several releases garnered a die-hard fandom in niche circles of internet/music culture, and then caught the attention of the late Peter Rehberg, the renowned artist and curator of the Editions Mego label, an expectation was set that the next Emeralds record was going to be a big one. is a mystical journey to outer lands, strange landscapes on strange planets, dreamlike fairy tales, impressive atmospheres of bleak worlds and dark shadowlands.

Ambient sounds of sonorous carpets and entangled sequences let you drift away into other worlds.

Mutagénèse presents their second SynGate release, "Voices", which is surprisingly different to many electronic projects. A lot of experimental joy is to be found in those vivid sounds of the new album. Some tracks are well-danceable, others invite you to listen to cheery melodies. Perfect for the chill room at a dance party.

Entering the captivating world of Mutagenese's electronic music means transporting yourself to places where it is sometimes difficult to distinguish reality from imagination. The Voices album offers a deep dive into the human soul, capturing emotions and sensations through the magic of female voices in symbiosis with synthesizers, adding a unique sensory dimension to each piece.

WHITE NOISE FROM ELECTRONIC TOYS

Why do we think that it's always possible to turn around and follow our footsteps back? In music, fortunately, we can do anything, even turn back time.

Mindheal is a project of composer and music producer Wojciech Stecko. He blends classic sounds inspired by the 70's and 80's into modern electronic patterns. Unique atmosphere of retro-sounding analog synths and a combination of lush atmospheric textures, unconventional beats or even orchestral elements with vintage sound of machines from the bygone era. This is the music that he loves to produce.



I am concerned about the direction the world is heading towards. We allowed ourselves to be digitized. Dehumanized.

I love the sound of analogue synths from a previous era, deep, non-ideal, with flaws. In the same way, I miss the "analogue" people for whom cracks and scratches create the perfection of this worldpeople who choose pen and paper over tablets.

The crackle of vinyl instead of sterile binary perfection. Yesterday's people lost in time. Frozen in the frame of old technology, among cassettes and tapes. Developing photos from the film. Living a real life, not online. With human beings, not bots.

Divine Matrix returns with Volume 4 of his Soundscapes series of electronic music excursions. Bioluminescence continues the theme in a more ambient, experimental style. There's plenty of creativity though within this drifting, ethereal space music journey. Steve is a master at creating ambient spaces populated with just the right amount of spaced out textures end effects. There are no drums or rhythms here, just gentle rhythmic motion supplied by delicate sequences.

The result is 9 tracks of varied, atmospheric spaced out ambient music with a darker, pulsating undertone. When rhythmic sequences do appear, they do so in an understated and gorgeously chilled out way. Thestunningly beautiful The Beauty in Things epitomising the artist'sbrilliance.

Overall, this is an evocative and spaced out trip on the wings of expertly crafted ambient electronica.





Named for the Zen parable of the Broken Cup, which teaches acceptance in the face of misfortune, Cup is a new album of solitude and celebration by veteran electronic music artist AeTopus (Bryan Hughes), and his first release on Spotted Peccary Music label. On Cup, AeTopus explores humanity's place in nature through a stunning synthesis of electronic beats and rhythmic structures combined with saturated ambiences of enduring beauty. Here, he captures the calm and wildness of the forest in thirteen tracks of complex time signature serenity, suggesting the solace found when, divested from external pressures, one embraces their own impermanence.

When composing, AeTopus builds lush soundscapes from pulsing electronic sequences and traditional percussion, then subtracts and subtracts from them. As a trained visual artist, AeTopus learned the value of negative space and applies that knowledge to these compositions. This approach leaves fragments of interlocking elements with simultaneous sparseness and complexity. "Pure" ebbs and flows around an odd-meter beat, briefly interrupted by sylvan guitar. "Glance" swells from a stuttering warble into a subtle, propulsive rhythm. "Access" hypnotizes with its strobing beat, a darkly reflective counterpoint to the album's peacefulness. Ultimately Cup is a work of passion that demonstrates the artistic process throughout all the pieces with such refined, beautiful expression.

In AeTopus's own words: "Cup is the product of my time in the natural world, and of the realization that the universe is scarcely affected by the triumphs, tragedies, and day-to-day lives of even the greatest of personalities, the mightiest of nations, or the most enduring of belief systems." Cup is an album of exploration and acceptance, a celebration of our place in the cosmos, however small it may be.

Like nearly all Inquiri music, there is a distinct element of heartache mixed with hope; each song mixes elements of drone, voice, field recording, and intense layers of sound to draw in the listener to sit together with her, leaning into the complex space of each piece and its corresponding idea After a long hiatus, Los Angeles-based ethereal electronic music producer Inquiri (Lacey Harris) re-emerges with her first fully ambient release, created "almost out of necessity" during her eighteen months of solitude during the height of the intense events of 2020, with the goals of both fostering hope within, and spreading ease, comfort, and healing to others in the most difficult times many had ever experienced before.

Inspired by her own personal journey of learning to quiet the noise of the mind, listen, and be still during times of emotional chaos, Seven explores Harris' interpretations of a series of major spiritual imperatives/states of being, moving through them from the most basic and visceral to the most evolved and superhuman.







'Seabuckthorn' is the solo work of Andy Cartwright. Exploring various approaches on guitars, with fingerpicking, bowing and slides, often with layered accompaniments.

.Cartwright shows an impressive balance of restraint and virtuosity in his playing, from building up bubbling, open-ended rhythms and textures or articulating intricate melodies. There's an elemental mystery to the atmosphere conveyed that makes me think of Ben Chasny's work in Six Organs of Admittance, Dean McPhee and more drone-oriented Americana practitioners like Robbie Basho or Jack Rose. But this isn't just a record of solo guitar picking (or spooky bowing) by a long shot. It feels meticulously put together with layers of overdubs, richly textured percussion and brooding reverb-drenched atmospheric sounds.

The Vivid Vibration EP creates sound fields that blend pure textural sound with elements of post-rock, noise pop, and even ambient dub. There is an overlapping of atmospheres and unexpected melodic highlights. From the moody beauty of the opening track to the spatial overload of the closer, this EP is all about the vibration.

The mixes take advantage of filtered, effected guitar textures and electronics. Sounds move forward and back in the mix using touch pad-controlled treatments that allow the listener to hear sounds being tweaked by hand or the slightest finger movement/ pressure.

More than an aural picture, there is a sonic space that this EP reveals with repeated listening.

When was the last time you looked at the sky? Get outside, NOW.
