GLENNMAINE

Glenn Main is a Norwegian electronic music composer whose music is influenced by luminaries such as Jean Michel Jarre, Klaus Schulze, Vangelis, Tangerine Dream, and Kitaro. He has subsequently carved a niche for himself by creating well-produced, melodic electronic music that clearly mirrors his influences yet strikingly retains a totally unique style.

This EP directly results from Glenn's isolation during the Calima in the Canary Islands in 2024. In the daytime, Glenn made this EP in his hotel room. You can hear the feelings in the songs.

Those who have had the pleasure of seeing Glenn Main in concert will know that he is a sublime talent. This shows us that musically and creatively, he is now a serious force to be reckoned with!

Interdwell's twelve compositions draw inspiration from the personal and the cosmic, the natural and fantastical worlds. The album's first epic opens with Fortunate One, featuring chanting from the late Sonam Targee and builds layer upon layer from there. Halfway through, a propulsive bass groove entwines with Targee's chants, shifting from melancholic to euphoric, celebrating the time we're gifted with those we love. Warm Inlet was inspired by a view of the Adirondacks on 7th Lake that can only be seen by boat; new wave guitar warbles paint the glimmering whitecaps, a steady bassline the powerful undercurrent, with Vangelis-esque synth chords the sun on the mountain peaks. Dreamlike and reflective, The Slow Train Home was born from Eric "the" Taylor's first ever recording session with Marotta and bassist Tony Levin (Peter Gabriel, King Crimson) over 20 years ago. Levin's emotive upright bass glides through an electronic landscape, both airy and rich, a traveller watching the hills roll by.


The title track takes the listener beyond Earth, depicting humanity's journey through space: the tribal march of Marotta's percussion as a voyager, shimmering sequencers as stars through the viewport, anthemic electric guitar as a starship's acceleration, a distant destination finally reached.

Interdwell is a vivid, inspiring odyssey throughout, a work that carries the listener from a sun-dappled lake to the furthest reaches of space and back again, leaving only the desire to experience it all over again





MATZUMI IS KATHRIN MANZ: SYNTHESIZERS AND VOCALS

For many years, the Danish electronic musician Bjorn Jeppesen creates music under the name Nattefrost. His music can be called a mixture of melodically, traditional, EM and icy atmospheric ambient sounds, perfectly litting the landscapes of the Scandinavian countries. Matzumi is not a Japanese woman but the artist name of the German electronic musician and singer Rathrin Manz. Her "K-Day Festival" concert in 2011 made a huge impression. Her music is also "ambient" but with a modern twist. It sounded interesting when the two announced they would make an album together.

The atmosphere is an important element in "Krom Distant Times". The album opens in a guite classical and bombastic way in "Kirst Movement." Vangelis greets us here clearly. "Evolution opens similarly.

The main melody in "The Ancient Irand" has traces of the music of ambient grandmaster Latrick O'Hearn. Vangelis again comes to mind while listening to "The Lortal". Matzumi sings here without text, bringing the music in the direction of Irisa Gerrard, who, in her turn, has collaborated with another KM greatness, Klaus Schulze. "Medieval" is a wonderful track with a link to Vangelis. The choirs sound excellent here, and the melody is euphoric and melancholic. To stay with the founders of KM: "The New Dawn is a kind of symphonic variation on the music of Jean Michel Jarre. "Cold Midwinter Nights" closes the album, showing the two sides of the duo with an impressive ambient opening and a melodic ending.





As always, I created the artwork for this album entirely by myself. It combines my own photos, their alteration, and the use of DALL-E.





Originally founded in the spring of 1996. The name refers to the Dutch word "de ramp" which means "disaster" or "catastrophe".

Between 1997 and 2003, ['ramp] released a string of albums and played a couple of concerts in the Netherlands, the UK, and Germany before Parsick went entirely solo in 2009.





most of the music was recorded around the same time "arp-en-ciel" and "happy days" were recorded, and up to a certain point it wasn't quite clear which piece of music would end up on what album. by late 2022, it had become obvious which pieces belonged together to form a coherent whole that would also have a narrative element of its own. "havoc" was third in line, with "arp-en-ciel" and "happy days" being released in reversed order.

shortly after i had finished the rough edits of the album in mid-august 2022 i had to learn about mark shreeve's passing. this devastating news overshadowed the production process in many ways, and in some respect i would like to view this album as some sort of tribute to mark and the lessons he taught me, with the title track "havoc" in particular (i am sure he would have liked that "massive sequencing-meets-mellotron" thing).















The "space race" fueled our imaginations, looking outward to the infinite in search of otherworlds. However, most of our use of space has been turned inward – from communications satellites to even conducting war, squabbling over our finite space and resources on this planet rather than looking outwards toward the infinite possibilities we were promised. The album 'Finite Space' uses the genre of "space music" as a leaping off point to look at these results from different angles.



As a teenager in the 70s, Chris Meyer took lessons on piano, bass, and modular synthesizers. He went on to write code and help design products for Sequential Circuits, Digidesign, Tom Oberheim's Marion Systems, and Roland R&D where he was chief engineer.

He is perhaps best known as the creator of Vector Synthesis. Chris also taught synthesis at UCLA Extension, wrote numerous articles for Music Technology Magazine plus a column for Keyboard Magazine, and was technical chairman of the MIDI Manufacturers Association, where he authored several additions to the spec, including MIDI Time Code. After a two-decade detour in the video and film industry, he recently returned to modular synthesis, creating videos, courses, and articles under Learning Modular.

He co-authored the popular book Patch & Tweak. Proving that one who teaches can also "do" most recently, he has been focusing on composing and performing sweeping, emotional electronic music under the name Alias Zone which combines synthesizers, samplers, field recordings, and percussion instruments.



Grauglanz Licht Schatten

Grauglanz is an electronic music project from Essen, Germany.Influenced and inspired by Berlin School and Krautrock-like music.

It all started in 1975/1976, with a visit to Dieter (the name has been changed), an older friend who was in tune with the times when it came to music...

Then I saw her, and it was love at first sight. The strangelooking shapes and unusual proportions immediately captivated me. Klaus Schulze's third album, Black Dance, was my first encounter with electronic music.

Until then, my music-making had been limited to the usual guitar strumming and banging on the bongos, more for the girls than for myself. However, listening to the albums by Klaus Schulze, Tangerine Dream, Ashra, and Kraftwerk, to name a few, made me desire to make such music myself. That was my thing.

The decision to play the keyboard matured, and a lucky coincidence sent me the organist from my home church, where I was actively involved in youth work and who was willing to teach me. At first, I played on the large church organ in our community (it was great; after all, not every one of that age has a key to the church, so they can practice there at any time); later on, I played on my first electric organ, Dr Boehm. It was all nice but not satisfying.

There was an Electronic Music Working Group in Essen at the VHS (Volkshochschule)! I booked the next course immediately, and there they were, the objects of my electronic dreams: The Korg MS series with MS10, MS20, MS50, and the SQ10 sequencer, a Yamaha CS-01 and a lot of small devices, later to add a Roland Juno-6. I was in heaven! After three years of learning and inspiration, the adult education centre cancelled the course.

Of course, my own electronic equipment also grew in the meantime. Dr. Böhm was joined by his first 'real' synthesizer, a Hammond 102200. It was quite a strange box but with some nice sounds. More was to follow. But as sometimes happens, I was young and needed the money, and everything was sold.

It wasn't until many years later that it hit me again, and I started buying a few instruments for the second time. Then, a love breakup, and everything had to go under the hammer again. By the end of 2008, was my third attempt to produce my own electronic music. Coping with technical developments wasn't always as easy to digest straight away as it was back when everything had buttons, but it's still a lot of fun.

The time came in mid-2011 when I put a few pieces together and burned them onto CD; it was more for me. But as is sometimes the case, people close to me liked it, and then the whole thing took off.

That's how it became Grauglanz and my first album, Search For Traces...



HILLMAN & THANECO TIME VORTEX

This is my third collaboration with acclaimed British composer Steve Hillman. The idea behind this album was to recreate and re-imagine some of Steve's tracks from his 80s solo albums. Sun Tower and Star Cycle first appeared on the 1986 album New Horizon. Time Levels first appeared on the 1987 album Time Levels. First Light, Earth Pulse, Night Tides and Accumulator appeared on the 1988 album Worlds Beyond. The original versions of Prelude & Call Of The Sea first appeared on the 1989 album Phases. I composed the track Time Vortex, especially for this album, and Steve decided to name the album after this track.

I had the privilege to receive some of Steve's solo four-track recordings from the 80s (including midi files), and then I built up and even made some extensions to his tracks. I composed a new ending for Time Levels, dedicated to Linda. Also, Accumulator has a new ending based on Steve's original melodic idea. As you will notice after listening to this album, there are numerous other changes made to Steve's original recordings, but I tried to keep them subtle. Every change was made with respect to his original recordings and with the aim of revitalising them by introducing new ideas, sounds, and fx.
