Paul Ellis Three Trajectories


This is an album of three trilogies.(Or three pieces with three distinct sections each.)

We spent several days there, recording videos and samples of new compositions in a studio less than 100 meters away from de ocean.


This new album is also inspired by the landscapes, the weather, walks on the beach, and the sounds of seagulls and sea waves.




Mark Burford, aka Field Lines Cartographer, is one of the new generation of musicians crafting original sonic worlds in electronic music using primarily modular synths. He has garnered quite a reputation both for his live performances and a series of releases on labels such as Castles In Space, Quiet Details and Woodford Halse. He has also appeared on several Tone Science albums, notably Volume 8, last year's Tone Science Live event. Thus, the time seemed right to invite Mark to create a long-form solo release on the DiN imprint.

What is particularly fascinating is that Burford seems to channel the Kosmische Musik vibe of the early Tangerine Dream without actually trying to copy their style. His music ends up in a similar sound world but via a completely different path. He said, "I've always loved how music creates new worlds - imaginary environments you can live in. As a listener, you become immersed in a new reality for the duration of an album. Fully enveloped by textures, melodies, harmonies and rhythms, new pictures appear in the mind, new dreams ..., and strange & beautiful landscapes sketched in sound. An alternate, portable reality."

With a running time of nearly 70 minutes this is exactly what FLC achieves on this beautiful album. From the opening gentle undulations of 'The Sun In Splendour', the music is both familiar and yet strangely different. The epic, almost 20-minute piece, 'Collapsable Mantra', flirts with Berlin School sequencing but adds something new and fresh to the mix. The music has time and space to gently unfold, to grow organically where texture and harmony become one before finally coming to rest on the shimmering shoreline of the final track, 'Interference Patterns'.

As DiN celebrates its 25th anniversary, it's really satisfying to give such talented artists as Field Lines Cartographer a platform to spread the word about their fine music.



Call me stupid, but I thought I should go full circle and release 'Polarity' not only the way it was originally supposed to be but also in the format it was originally available: the trusty old C-60 audio cassette.

Of course, music cassettes are no longer available from your local supermarket or electronics supplier, and the supplies of original factory-sealed tapes I have is not enough to warrant a release of more than two or three copies. Hence, I had CO2 / Type II cassette tapes custom-made for me, complete with a slipcase to accommodate the original inlay made for the original batch of cassette releases in 1992! The first 15 orders will include an original copy of the promotional flyer 1992

I will limit the production run to 25 hand-numbered copies altogether. Each of them is made individually to order, using a trusty old RKRI GK95 for dubbing. Even though the inlay claims "Dolby System", I opted against using noise reduction -- I didn't like it back then and still don't like it.

When ordering a copy of 'Polarity' on cassette, please allow for two to three weeks for delivery as every copy is hand-made while supplies of tapes last (I might have to order another batch of tapes, which takes time).

Our acquaintance goes back even further into the dim and distant past when places like MySpace and LastFM still had a rather good reputation and seemed to be full of promise to newcomers in the vast worldwide electronic music scene...

I'm sure we must have already considered the idea of doing a full album together even back then, and now, it has finally happened!!!

Of course, we recorded several more tracks over the years - originally for various "Volumes" of the wonderful "Cousin Silas & Friends" series, which featured collaborations with dozens of fellow artists and the great man.

We decided to include those tracks, which had been scattered across several albums, in this one because now, for the first time, they appear in their very own context, AND it's the first time that they are also available on CD.

But don't fear! Even in the unlikely case that You should be already familiar with all of them, there is much new music to be discovered that Cousin Silas and I have recorded between January and May 2024.






AGITATION FREE

Agitation Free was formed in Berlin, Germany, in 1967 by Lutz 'Liüül' Ulbrich, Michael 'Fame' Günther, Lutz 'Ludwig' Kramer, and Christoph Franke. Initially, the group called "The Agitation" was formed at the end of 1966 by the merger of members from the Berlin rock bands "The Centries" (Lutz Ulbrich, Christoph Franke) and "The Ugly Things" (Lutz Kramer, Michael Günther). The band had to change its name because another band already had the same name and chose "Agitation Free" based on a poster for a promo gig with free admission. Known for their multimedia light shows, they became the house band for the notorious Zodiac Club in Berlin. In 1968, vocalist John L. joined the group but was fired within a year, possibly due to his provocative stage behavior. In 1970, Ludwig Kramer left and was replaced by Ax Genrich. Similarly, Christoph Franke left the same year to join Tangerine Dream, who shared practice space with Agitation Free. To fill these gaps, the group recruited Jorg Schwenke and Gerd Klemke. However, Klemke didn't stay long, and the group finally stabilized in 1971 as a quintet with the addition of Michael Hoenig and Burghard. In 1972, the group toured Egypt, Lebanon, Jordan, and Greece and made a recording during this time that appeared on their first LP, 'Malesch' (translating to 'It's Okay', released in June 1972). The LP showcased their innovative fusion of psychedelic rock, electronic and ambient sounds, and influences from world music, particularly from the Middle East.

In March 1973, Schwenke left the group and was replaced by Stefan Diez. At the same time, a second drummer, Dietmar Burmeister, joined the group. This lineup was featured on the posthumous release 'Last', and without Diaz, the group recorded their 2nd LP in Munich in July 1973. Shortly after this, Diez quit and was replaced by Gustl Lutjens. The group made their final studio recordings in 1974 and then disbanded after a goodbye concert in Berlin in November 1974. (Material from 1974 would later appear on the 'Last LP', the 'Fragments' album, and 'The Other Sides Of' CD.) However, the band would return with original members, releasing a comeback album in 1999 with River Of Return.



In February 2007, Agitation Free reunited to perform a series of concerts in Tokyo to mark the occasion of member Michael Hoenig's addition to the "Progressive Rock" section of the Tokyo Tower Wax Museum.

Unknown to them, a multitrack recording was made of all three concerts that took place at the O'West venue in Tokyo's Shibuya district, resulting in the album Shibuya Nights. The band promoted the album at celebrated concerts between 2012 and 2014 in London, Manchester, Paris, Berlin, and at the renowned Burg Herzberg Festival.

In November 2023 they released their new studio album "Momentum". The Krautrock legends pick up where their debut "Malesch" from 1972 left off. Joining the band are the four original members Lutz "Lüül" Graf-Ulbrich (electric guitar, acoustic guitar, banjo), Michael Hoenig (keyboards, synthesizer, electronic percussion), Gustl Lütjens (†2017, electric guitar, acoustic guitar, vocals) and Burghard Rausch (drums, electronic percussion



Natalia Quest is a singer-songwriter originally from Russia. She has a degree in music and psychology and has also studied professional astrology and various esoteric, shamanic, and holistic modalities. Natalia has been involved in music from a very young age.

She graduated from the College of Culture and Arts as an artist & performer. However, due to a complex vocal trauma, she was forced to shift her focus to other areas of life. At the age of 18, she moved to Moscow, where she graduated from the Moscow Socio-Pedagogical Institute with a degree in psychology. Meanwhile, her passion for music never went away. In 2015, Natalia recorded an EP album in collaboration with sound designer and mixing engineer Alex Bel. Their synergy was unique, and thanks to their combination of depth, professionalism, and perfectionism, the desired result was achieved. However, Alex could not proceed with the project due to family circumstances.

In 2015, Natalia moved to Los Angeles, where she deepened her knowledge and practices in psychology and shamanism. She currently resides in Los Angeles and has travelled throughout the United States, becoming deeply acquainted with local power places and Native American heritage.





Paul Asbury Seaman Mayr has released nine albums in 2023 (so far) and Third Nature continues his characteristic blend of soaring melodies and lively sequencing. Typically, his rhythms are more methodical and thoughtful rather than propulsive. That means hypnotic atmospheres, rather than the techno-beats so many EM artists these days think is "Berlin School." (Not.) Plenty of quiet acoustic passages here to move your heart, if not your feet, all the more precious for their brevity beneath sequencer tapestries.

Third Nature illuminates zones of transition, overlap and transformation between the spheres of the cultural and the natural. The music thus opens up a space for current debates about nature and technology, ecology and economics, politics and aesthetics.

For Buyers of the Album is a Bonus Track included: The Deserts of Vulcan from the Album "Modular Sessions 16" by Mark Jenkins and Fritz Mayr.
